I am pleased to report to you, the Denver Section membership, that the Section is in a sound financial position. The Executive Committee, at it's first meeting for 1988, held on February 3rd, accepted the 1987 financial report which shows that the Section financial position increased by 3.1% in 1987. The General Fund balance is slightly less than the yearly budget of \$17,000. A 1988 budget projecting a modest surplus, based on an expense budget of \$16,000 was approved by the Executive Committee.

The Student Fund and the Awards Fund, both of which are endowments under separate committee control from the General Fund, will again this year provide funding for student activities in the Section and provide for awards which are presented at the May Awards Banquet.
