At the IRE Executive Committee meeting on October 6, I introduced discussion of a possible joint membership arrangement between the IRE and the AIEE, as a result of our talk of August 1. It was felt that this would be a desirable arrangement and that we would so recommend to the IRE Board of Directors.

Would you care to indicate further as to your thoughts concerning the willingness of the AIEE to join with the IRE in this matter? We have assumed that the wording of a suitable agreement between our Societies might be identical to that of the agreement between the AIEE and the ASME.
