

MOBIUS, the MO(del) B(ased) I(nformation) A(ccess) S(ystem) is an object-oriented data browsing environment developed in 1991 in response to a US West need for better access to data stored in relational databases. This system was conceived with two end user groups in mind: For non-technical end users with no prior familiarity with databases or data query languages, it was designed to provide ad hoc, day-to-day access to corporate subject data without any need for prior training in data modeling or querying. For data access developers and system administrators, it was designed to be adaptable to any relational data model without the requirement for source code programming or data model redesign. This talk will outline the basic architecture, information and control flow, and usability or MOBIAS and its components.

"Quasi-Optical Microwave Power Combining"

At microwave and millimeter-wave frequencies, individual solid-state devices give limited output power levels. However, compared to the alternative tube sources, they are reliable, compact, inexpensive and require small power supplies. Obtaining high power levels from solid-state devices is therefore of interest. Quasi-optical power combining is a possible approach. Theoretical and experimental results from MESFET power combiners with up to one hundred devices will be presented. The devices load a two-dimensional grid and form an active surface. Several subsystems containing other types of active surfaces, such as varactor loaded grids, will also be presented.
