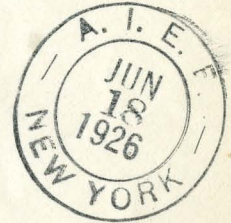

Her address at the present time is Niele Buhk School, Ollerup, Denmark.

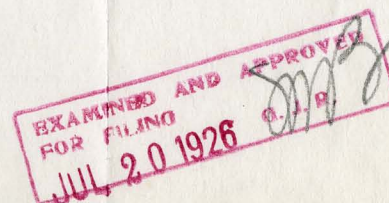
