National Engineers! Register. The Executive Committee took note of the suggestion of the Engineers' Joint Council, that a study be made of the usefulness of compiling and publishing a National Engineers' Register, to list the membership rosters of all major national engineering and scientific societies, and that this study might be undertaken by a committee with representation from each society involved.

The comment was made that such a register might serve a useful purpose, but that its preparation would logically seem to fall within the functions of the National Science Foundation.

It was agreed that President Weber, who is now serving on the Executive Committee of the Engineers' Joint Council, will explore this matter further with Mr. Harold Osborne of that organization.

139. International Conference on Electrical Engineering Education, July, 1960 The Executive Committee took note of a letter from the Chairman of the Education Committee, under date of October 16, 1959, soliciting IRE support of a proposed International Conference on Electrical Engineering Education, to be held at Syracuse University in July, 1960.

The Executive Committee agreed that the Professional Group on Education which had lent support to this conference in the past, be authorized to continue participations tion in the 1960 International Conference on Electrical Engineering Education, on behalf of the IRE, and that the Chairman of the Education Committee would be advised accord 'ngly.

1962 SWIRECO. The Executive Committee took note of a letter from R. J. Loofbourrow, Chairman of the Houston Section, under date of October 26, 1959, requesting approval to schedule the 1962 SWIRECO in Houston, Texas, for three days during the week of April 9-14, 1962, the specific three days to be selected in approximately six months.

Dr. Henderson moved that the Executive Committee approve the request time for the 1962 SWIRECO. (Unanimously approved.)

IRE-AIEE Joint Student Publication. The Executive Committee took note of a letter from the Chairman of the Education Committee, under date of October 16, 1959, wherein he advised that, at a joint meeting of the IRE-AIEE Education Committee and the officers of the Electrical Engineering Division of ASEE held in Chicago on October 13, 1959, a motion was adopted unanimously favoring a joint Student publication for IRE and AIEE.

A copy of the first issue of "EE Digest", a new AIEE Student publication, was displayed to the members of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee agreed that, because AIEE had now initiated ublication of its own Student journal, it appeared unnecessary to undertake a joint RE-AIEE student publication at this time, and that President Weber would advise the Chairman of the Education Committee accordingly.
