1) Review of Present Publications

Attached is copy of a financial summary on "IRE & AIEE Publications", 11/16/62, which was distributed and discussed in detail with reference to sample copies of each. I doubt that the costs of IRE publications are truly comparable with those shown for AIEE. For example, no "Rent" is included, because IRE pays no rent!

This consumed most of the morning.

Re IRE Proceedings, it seemed to be the view of the IRE'ers that:

- a) Very few members read the technical papers, but all of them keep the book for reference (implication being that after reading EE, if they do, AIEE members throw it away).
- b) Lots of advertisers are afraid to drop out.
- c) AIEE made a mistake in separating technical papers from monthly magazine; present EE does not attract advertisers (this view held mostly by Sinclair).

Herwald was under the impression that the Bimonthlies are comparable in quality to P/G Transactions. I did my best to refute this idea.

There is no doubt how Ryder, et al, are thinking. Unfortunately, the financial picture, if it is true, supports their view.

Interestingly, the IRE Directory is in the red \$40,000 to \$50,000/yr. % 63,161 I remember so well when Dr. Green wanted us to put advertising in our Directory and make money as IRE does, instead of losing it!

The Student Quarterly costs \$50,000 (including salary of student advisor); \$30,000 in printing. IRE spends \$12/Student Member; receives \$5 dues.

2) IEEE Tentative Budget

Fink arrived as we were finishing luncheon (12:30-2:00 PM), and discussed the budget and various publication matters. He was still talking when I left at 4:25 PM.
