THE INSTITUTE OF ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONICS ENGINEERS INCORPORATED

100. MEMBERSHIP

1. The grades of IEEE membership are:

- a. Honorary Member
- b. Fellow c. Senior Member
- d. Member
- e. Associate
- f. Student

The term "member" when printed without an initial gapital, where used in these Bylaws, includes all grades of membership.

- The designation "Life Member" is applicable only to all members who have attained the age of 65 years and who have been members of the IEEE or one of its two predecessor societies for at least 35 years, or who have attained the age of 70 after having been members for 30 years. All members having the designation "Life Member" or "Member-for-Life" in the predecessor societies shall be designated as a "Life Member" in the IEEE. Any member who would have been qualified on or before December 31, 1963, to be a Member-for-Life of AIEE, under the rules of eligibility of the AIEE, or to be a Life Member of IRE, under the rules of the IRE, shall be qualified to be a Life Member
- The designation "Group Affiliate" refers to individuals who are not members but who are entitled to participate in certain Group activities under provisions established by the Executive Committee as specified in the Bylaws.

#### M. Rights and Privileges

- 1. Honorary Members shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the IEEE except the right to hold office therein.
- 2. Fellows shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the IEEE.
- 3. Senior Members shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the IEEE except the right to serve on the Fellow Committee
- 4. Members shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of the IEEE except the right to hold (1) any corporate office, (2) the office of Director, (3) membership on the Admission and Advancement Committee, the Awards Board or the Fellow Committee.
- 5. Associates shall be entitled to attend meetings of IEEE members, to vote only on matters presented to groups of members (such as Groups and Sections), to be appointed on committees with the right to vote when specifically approved by the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee, but shall not have the right to hold any office.
- 6. Students' rights and privileges are defined in the Student Manual.
- 7. Life Members have those privileges associated With their grade immediately before becoming a Life Member or with such higher grade to which they may be advanced.
- $\boldsymbol{\theta}.$  Group Affiliates are entitled to participate in certain Group activities under provisions established by the Executive Committee as specified in the Bylaws.

- 9. The emblem of IEEE will be protected by legal registration and shall be reproduced only in connection with official business of the IEEE.
- 10. Emblems to be worn by members are to be purchasable only from IEEE Headquarters.
- 11. Assertion of IEEE membership by members for purely personal purposes is authorized, including the right to use the following abbreviations:

Hon.Mem.IEEE Fel.IEEE Sen.Mem.IEEE Mem.IEEE Assoc. TEEE

12. Every member of the IEEE shall receive those publications of the IEEE specified by the Board of Directors.

#### 105. Qualifications

- 1. Honorary Members are elected by the Board of Directors from among those who have rendered meritorious service to mankind in engineering or other allied fields. Election is by the unanimous affirmative vote, by secret ballot, of all of the members of the Board of Directors present at a regularly constituted meeting. Nominees may be proposed to the Board of Directors in writing by not less than ten members. Proposals for the election of Honorary Members do not come under the review of the Admission and Advancement Committee. The election of an Honorary Member shall be deemed invalid if acceptance is not received within six months from the date of his election.
- 2. Fellow: The grade of Fellow is one of unusual professional distinction and shall be conferred only by invitation of the Board of Directors upon a person of outstanding and extraordinary qualifications and experience in the fields of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences, who meets the requirements for Senior Member as stated in these Bylaws and who has been a member in any grade for a period of seven years preceding the year of nomination, except that the seven-year provision in any individual case may be waived for cause by the Board of Directors.
- 3. Senior Member is the highest professional grade for which application may be made and shall require experience or attainment reflecting professional maturity. For admission or transfer to the grade of Senior Member, a candidate shall be an engineer, scientist, educator, technical executive or originator in the fields of electrical or electronics engineering and science, radio, allied branches of engineering or related sciences and arts.

He shall have been in the active practice of his profession for at least ten years and shall have attained distinction as measured by performance over a period of at least five of these years. such performance including one or more of the following:

- a. Publication of important original engineering or scientific papers, books or inventions, or
- b. Technical direction with evidence of accomplishment of important scientific or engineering work, or
- c. Creative contributions to the welfare of the scientific or engineering profession, or
- d. Establishment or furtherance of important scientific or engineering courses in "a school of recognized standing," or

- e. Contributions equivalent to those of "a" to "d" above in areas such as technical editing, patent prosecution or patent law, provided these contributions serve to advance progress substantially in the fields of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences.
- Member grade is a professional grade limited to those who have demonstrated professional competence in the fields of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences. For admission or transfer to the grade of Member, a candidate shall be either:
  - a. An engineer or scientist in the fields of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences, who shall have had at least three years of professional experience, or shall have graduated from a course of study of at least four academic years duration, or its equivalent, in those fields, in a "school of recognized standing."
  - b. A teacher of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences, who shall have graduated from a course of study of at least four academic years duration, or its equivalent, in those fields, in a "school of recognized standing," or who has had at least three years of professional teaching experience and shall have participated in planning and conducting
  - c. A person regularly employed in the fields of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences, for at least six years who, by experience, has demonstrated competence in work of a professional character.
  - d. An executive who, for at least six years, has had under his direction important technical, engineering or research work in the fields of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences.
- Associate: For admission or transfer to this grade, the applicant must satisfy the IEEE that he is interested in and capable of rendering service to electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences and that his admission to this grade will contribute to the welfare of the IEEE.
- 6. Under the membership grade of Student there shall be two classifications: Student and Student Associate.
  - a. A Student member must carry at least 30 per cent of a normal full-time academic program as a registered undergraduate or graduate student in a regular course of study in electrical engineering, electronics, radio, an allied branch of engineering, or the related arts and sciences in a "school of recognized standing."
  - b. A Student Associate member must carry at least 30 per cent of a normal full-time academic program as a registered student in a regular course of study in electrical engineering, electronics, radio, an allied branch of engineering or the related arts and sciences in an institution, other than a "school of recognized standing, approved by the Executive Committee.

- 7. A Student entering military service shall retain the status while in military services. A Student entering military service his Student status while in military service to those years, or longer upon ne a period of three years, or longer upon recertification.
- 8. Graduation from a course of at least 18 months duration of study in electrical engineering, duration of study in classification of engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering. neering or the related arts and sciences in an neering or the related a "school of recognized institution, other than a "school of recognized institution, other than a control of recognized standing", approved by the Executive Committee, may be accepted as equivalent to one year's professional experience in those fields.
- 9. Full-time graduate work, or part-time graduate Full-time graduate nois, work with teaching or research, in the fields of electrical engineering, electronics, radio. of electrical engineering or the related allied branches of engineering arts and sciences, in a "school of recognized arts and sciences, in a standing, may be accepted as equivalent to professional experience.
- 10. The time requirements for admission or transfer The time requirements to any grade of membership may be satisfied by applying pro rata the experience of the candi date under the various alternative requirements for the grade.
- 11. The term "school of recognized standing" refers only to schools which award degrees for not less than four academic years, or its equivalent, of full-time academic study in electrical engineer. ing, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences, and are designated as such by the Executive Conmittee. There may be instances in areas outside of Regions 1 to 6 inclusive, where academic practices vary from those current in those Regions so that qualified Student candidates cannot comply with the requirements of this paragraph for a "school of recognized standing" In such cases, the Executive Committee shall establish criteria so that Students in such other areas may be qualified for membership.

#### 106. Applications

1. Applications for admission to the IEEE or for transfer to a higher grade shall be made on a form provided by the IEEE and shall embody a full record of the general technical education of the applicant and of his professional career. Applicants shall refer to the required number of members of the grades as specified below. Except in the case of Students applying for transfer to Member or Associate grade, each of these references shall be requested by the General Manager to fill out a prescribed confidential form for consideration by the Admission and Advancement Committee.

An application for any grade of membership, except Student, Fellow, or Honorary Member, received from a person who is a member of another society with which there is an approved reciprocal agreement and who holds equivalent or higher grade of membership in that society shall be processed directly by the General Manager without referral to the Admission and Advancement Committee.

Applicants for membership shall furnish names of references as follows:

For Member

por Senior Member - Five Fellows or Senior Members. - Four Fellows, Senior Members or Members.

For Associate

- The written endorsement (signature) of one IEEE member in any of the following grades: Member, Senior Member, Fellow, Honorary.

- The Counselor at his institution, if such Counselor exists; otherwise, a member of the faculty of his institution, normally one who is a member of IEEE.

should an applicant for admission or transfer certify that he is not personally known to the above specified number of IEEE members, who are sufficiently familiar with the applicant's experience to justify him in using their names as references, the Admission and Advancement Committee may, in its discretion, accept other references who are familiar with his professional work, preferably engineers or scientists of

- 3. Applications for admission or transfer to any grade of membership, except the grades of Honorary Member and Fellow, shall be addressed to the Board of Directors and submitted to IEEE Headquarters. Recommendation of election or transfer of an applicant to any grade, except the grades of Honorary Member and Fellow, shall be by three-quarters affirmative vote of the Admission and Advancement Committee.
- 4. A re-application for admission or transfer to a particular grade may be made after the expiration of one year from the date of a rejection.
- 5. The Executive Committee is authorized to act for the Board of Directors in electing members, readmitting members or transferring their membership grades, except where involving Honorary Member and Fellow grades, and may waive application and reference requirements in the transfer of members from Student to Associate or Member grade. (See also 302.1a.)

#### M. Proposals

- 1. Each year, the Fellow Committee shall recommend to the Board of Directors nominees for Fellow grade. A citation summarizing the accomplishments of the nominee shall be a part of each recommendation.
- 2. Admission or transfer to any grade except Fellow may be proposed by any member acting as sponsor by supplying to the Admission and Advancement Committee sufficient information and testimonials from the required number of references to satisfy the Admission and Advancement Committee as to qualifications. Such proposals shall be acted upon by the Admission and Advancement Committee and, if approved, transmitted to the Executive Committee. If approved by the Executive Committee, an invitation blank shall be sent to the proposed member inviting him to accept the grade of membership proposed, which membership shall become effective automatically and immediately upon his supplying the biographical and professional information required and paying the necessary dues and fees which must be received within six months.

#### 108. Admissions and Transfers

- 1. The entrance fee for all grades shall be three dollars (\$3.00) except that there shall be no entrance fee for the Student grade or from members of another society with which there is a reciprocal agreement. The Board of Directors may, under special circumstances, waive the entrance fee.
- 2. No entrance fee shall be charged a non-IEEE member of a Joint Student Branch or Joint Student Associate Branch, who is a student member of another national engineering society which is a sponsor with IEEE of the Joint Student Branch or Joint Student Associate Branch, and who applies for membership in the IEEE within six months after the termination of his student member status.
- 3. There shall be no transfer fees. A notice of approval of a transfer shall be sent to the member.
- 4. The membership period shall be dated as of the first day of the month after election. A notice that he has been elected shall be sent to every newlyadmitted member. He shall receive the first publication routinely mailed after receipt of his application.
- 5. The entrance fee and annual dues shall be payable with the application for admission to membership. Should the applicant fail of admission to membership, the sum remitted with the application shall be refunded.

Annual dues shall be applied to membership as follows:

If payment is received in the period October 1 to December 31, inclusive, membership shall continue until December 31 of the following year.

If payment is received in the period January 1 to March 31, inclusive, membership shall continue until December 31 of the current year.

If payment is received in the period April 1 to September 30, inclusive, the dues payable shall be one half of the annual dues, and membership shall continue until December 31 of the current year.

#### 109. Dues

- 1. The annual dues for all grades other than Student shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per year. The dues for Student grade shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per year. Student members transferring to a higher grade, without interruption of membership, shall pay dues of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for the first year of membership in the higher grade, except that such transferring Student members who reside in Regions 8, 9 and 10 shall pay annual dues of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for the first three consecutive years of membership in the higher grade.
- 2. Dues shall be waived for all Life Members of IEEE as defined in Bylaw 102. In determining the required years of membership (35 at age 65 years, and 30 at age 70), the following rules shall apply: (a) Only years in which membership dues were paid shall be counted, (b) Student membership years shall not be counted, (c) Years need not be consecutive, (d) Years in which membership dues, not including Student dues, were paid to AIEE or IRE shall be counted, (e) A year of concurrent membership in both AIEE and IRE shall be counted as one year only.

3. Under exceptional circumstances, as provided for in the Constitution, such as inability of a member to remit dues due to wartime conditions, the Board of Directors may, if it waives dues, also declare that during the period of such waiver, the member has maintained continuous membership.

#### 110. Billing, Termination and Reinstatement

- 1. The annual dues period is the calendar year. A bill covering annual dues, Group fees and subscriptions shall be mailed to every member not later than the beginning of the annual dues period. This bill may be paid in two equal installments due January 1st and July 1st. The first installment shall be paid not later than three months, and the second installment not later than nine months, after the beginning of the annual dues period.
  - 2. After prior notification, if the bill for annual dues shall not have been paid on or before the time specified in Bylaw 110.1, it shall be the duty of the General Manager to notify the member that, in accordance with the Bylaws of the IEEE, distribution to him of all publications has been discontinued and that if the dues remain unpaid on December 31 of the then current year, membership shall be terminated. Accompanying this notice shall be a final bill, with the suggestion that the member pay the bill and reinstate his membership.
- 3. Membership so terminated may be resumed on payment of all dues in arrears, or on payment of a new entrance fee and current dues in keeping with prior years of membership.
- 4. On resuming membership and paying dues in arrears. a member shall be restored to the publication mailing list and receive all issues from that date on. Publications that he would normaily have received had his membership status been continuous shall be considered forfeited. However, upon written request, these will be supplied, if available.
  - 5. When a membership is terminated, all subscriptions to IEEE publications that had been received by such person by reason of his former membership, also terminate as of the same date.
  - 6. The mailing of bills or statements to the last known address of a member, on record in the IEEE, shall be considered a valid notice of indebtedness.

#### 111. Resignations

- 1. A member in good standing may resign by submitting a written resignation to the Secretary.
- 2. Subject to the approval of the Executive Committee, a resigned member may resume his membership upon payment of current dues.

#### 112. Severances

1. To initiate action toward expulsion of a member, a signed complaint must be submitted to the Board of Directors which, if it deems the reason sufficient, shall notify the accused by letter of the charges against him and of the place and date of a hearing to consider such charges which shall be held not less than thirty days after mailing of the notice. The accused may present his defense in person, in writing, or by an authorized representative. There shall be a majority of the members of the Board present at the hearing and the votes cast must be unanimous in order to expel or suspend. The vote shall be considered not unanimous if any member abstains from voting. The action of the Board of Directors shall be final and conclusive. The complaint shall be final and observed of Directors does not seat on.

#### 200. ANNUAL ASSEMBLY

#### 201. How Constituted

1. The annual Assembly shall consist of ten Delegan at-Large elected by the voting members and elected Regional Delegates elected respectively by the members residing in Regions 1 to 8 inclusive of the IEEE, making a total of eighteen.

With the term beginning January 1, 1968, and the after, a Regional Delegate shall be elected by members residing in Region 9, making a total of nineteen.

- 2. The ten Delegates-at-Large shall be comprised of the President, the senior past President, the junior past President, the Vice President elected by the voting members, and six additional Delegation at-Large. The six additional Delegates-at-Large shall serve three year terms. Two of the six shall be elected each year so that the terms of two of the six additional Delegates-at-Large shall explan each year.
- 3. The Delegates elected by Regions shall be member of and reside in the Regions electing them and shall have terms of office of two years, the Delegation gates from even-numbered Regions being chosen and elected in even-numbered years and those from oddnumbered Regions in odd-numbered years. A vacanty shall occur in the office of Regional Delegate # such time as the incumbent ceases to reside in the Region that elected him. Such vacancy shall be filled by the Director selected to fill the corre sponding vacancy as provided in Article XI, Sec. of the Constitution.
- 4. As stated in the Constitution, all Delegates, both Delegates-at-Large and Regional Delegates, shall be elected Directors by virtue of their election as Delegates and shall serve terms as Directors concurrent with their terms as Delegates.
- 5. All Delegates shall be of Fellow or Senior Member grade.
- 6. The presiding officer of the annual Assembly, as provided by the Constitution, shall be the newly elected President.
- 7. Prior to the election of the Secretary or in the event of his absence, the General Manager shall perform the secretarial functions.

In the case of extraordinary circumstances, a special meeting of the Assembly or the designation of a place of meeting for annual Assembly other than IEEE Headquarters may be authorized by a than issue two-thirds vote of those present at a regularly constituted meeting of the Board of Directors held at least thirty days in advance of the date of such specially designated meeting.
- 2. A meeting of the Assembly may be held without notice if waivers of notice signed by all of the Delegates are filed with the Secretary with notation thereof entered in the minutes of the
- 3. Ten Delegates shall constitute a quorum at meetings of the Assembly.
- 4. Any notices of meetings or other official business required by the Constitution or these Bylaws to be mailed to Delegates shall be sent by such routings as shall ensure prompt delivery.
- 5. Reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses is authorized for Delegates for the purpose of attending any special or extraordinary meeting of the Assembly not associated with a meeting of the Board of Directors held contiguously with it.

#### M. Functions

- 1. The annual Assembly shall elect additional Directors for the required term of office of one year. One of these Directors shall represent Region 9, for the term beginning January 1, 1967 and ending December 31, 1967. This Director shall be elected, thereafter, as provided in Bylaw 201.1. Beginning January 1, 1967, an additional Director elected biannually by the annual Assembly shall represent Region 10. Four of these Directors shall be elected Corporate Officers, respectively designated as Vice President -Publication Activities, Vice President - Technical Activities, Secretary, and Treasurer. The annual Assembly shall also elect such alternate Directors as may be necessary to ensure the attaining of a total number of eight Directors including the Corporate Officers, in the event that consent to serve by any of the electees cannot be secured prior to the conclusion of that Assembly meeting.
- 2. The annual Assembly shall receive reports, verified by the President and Treasurer, or by the Board of Directors, showing the amount and status of real and personal property owned by the IEEE, its fiscal condition, changes in membership, changes in groups of members and other vital statistics, all of which are to be as of the most recent date available from the records kept by the Officers. These reports shall be filed with the records of the IEEE and abstracts thereof entered in the minutes of the proceedings of the Assembly.

# 300. MANAGEMENT

#### 301. Board of Directors

1. Effective January 1, 1967 and until December 31, 1967, the Board of Directors shall consist of ten Directors-at-Large elected by the voting members, eight Regional Directors elected respectively by the members residing in Regions 1 to 8 inclusive of the IEEE and nine Directors elected by the annual Assembly, making a total of twenty-seven.

On and after January 1, 1968, the Board of Directors shall consist of ten Directors-at-Large elected by the voting members, nine Regional Directors elected respectively by the members residing in Regions 1 to 9 inclusive of the IEEE and eight Directors elected by the annual Assembly, making a total of twenty-seven.

2. The ten Directors-at-Large shall be comprised of the President, the two surviving Past Presidents most recently retired from that office, the Vice President elected by the voting members and six Directors elected for three-year terms. Two of the six shall be elected each year so that the terms of two of the six Directors shall expire each year.

The Past Presidents shall be named Senior Past President and Junior Past President, the junior being the most immediate past holder of the Presidency.

- 3. The Directors elected by the annual Assembly, for the purposes of determining the total number of Directors-at-Large as distinguished from those elected by the Regions as specified in the Constitution, shall have Director-at-Large status.
- 4. The Directors elected by Regions shall be members of and reside in the Regions electing them and shall have terms of office of two years, the Directors from even-numbered Regions being chosen and elected in even-numbered years, and those from odd-numbered Regions in odd-numbered years. A vacancy shall occur in the office of Regional Director at such time as the incumbent ceases to reside in the Region that elected him. The existence of such a vacancy shall be established by the Executive Committee upon receipt of information from the Regional Director, or other IEEE Officer, an officer of a Section within the Region or from the records maintained by the General Manager. Residence for the purpose of this Bylaw shall be as determined by the member's Section affiliation, as defined in Bylaw 402.1.
- 5. All Directors shall be of Fellow or Senior Member grade.
- 6. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors, required by the Constitution to be held during January of each year, shall be held immediately after the adjournment of the annual Assembly and at the same place. Notices thereof shall be mailed at the same time that notices are mailed for the annual Assembly.
- 7. At the annual meeting, the Board shall determine the time and place of other meetings to be held throughout the year, which normally shall not be more than three.
- 8. The time and place of any scheduled Board meeting may be altered or the meeting cancelled only by majority vote at a regularly constituted meeting of the Board of Directors or by consent of a majority of all Directors secured by or transmitted to the Secretary, not less than twenty days before the original date or the new date set for the meeting, whichever is the earlier. Notice of such approved change shall be mailed to all Directors not less than ten days before the original or the new date, whichever is the earlier.
- 9. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by any five Directors on notice to all other Directors. Notice of such special meetings giving the time and place of meeting, the purpose of the meeting and the names of the Directors calling the

- meeting shall be mailed to all Directors not less than twenty days before the date set for the special meeting. The place of such special meetings may be only at IEEE Headquarters unless otherwise authorized by a majority vote of all Directors, such vote to be secured by or transmitted to the Secretary.
- 10. A meeting of the Board of Directors may be held without notice if waivers of notice signed by all of the Directors are filed with the Secretary with notation thereof entered in the minutes of the meeting.
- In the absence or incapacity of the Secretary, the General Manager shall perform the secretarial functions.
- 12. Notices of meetings and any other documents required to be sent to Directors pursuant to provisions of the Constitution and these Bylaws shall be sent by such routings as shall ensure prompt delivery.
- 13. Fourteen Directors shall constitute a quorum at meetings of the Board of Directors.
- 14. Reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses is authorized for Directors for the purpose of attending meetings of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, and meetings taking place during the IEEE International Convention and Exhibition, for one other general meeting each year, and for meetings at which the Director performs duties assigned to his office.
- 15. Reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses is authorized for Regional Directors for the purpose of visiting the Sections and Subsections within their respective Regions.

#### 302. Executive Committee

- The Board of Directors at its annual meeting shall appoint an Executive Committee composed of Directors, to exercise powers and assume duties of management as directed by the Board of Directors and as may be outlined in the Bylaws, subject to the following limitations:
  - a. That the Board of Directors may at any meeting overrule any act or decision of the Executive Committee.
  - b. That the Board of Directors may suspend at any meeting any power conferred upon the Executive Committee by resolution or by these Bylaws, such suspension to remain in effect pending repeal of any Bylaw conferring such power, or
  - c. That the Board of Directors may direct any action or plan of the Executive Committee.
- 2. The Executive Committee shall be comprised of the President, the Vice President elected by the voting members, the two Vice Presidents elected by the annual Assembly, the Junior past President, the Treasurer, the Secretary, and two other Directors. The President shall be Chairman, the Vice President elected by the voting members shall be Vice Chairman and the Secretary shall be Secretary thereof.
- 3. At the first meeting of a newly-appointed Executive Committee, it shall schedule other meetings throughout the year. Minutes of the meetings of the Executive Committee shall be mailed to all Directors.
- 4. The terms of office of members of the Executive Committee shall begin with the annual meeting of the Board of Directors and shall continue until the succeeding annual Assembly.
- 5. The Executive Committee may divide its duties and responsibilities among its members as it sees fit and conduct its business as it finds necessary. It shall appoint certain of its members as "Coordinators" charged with functional supervision of activities such as membership, standards, etc. One of its members shall be Chairman of the Technical Activities Board and another shall be Chairman of the Publications Board. The Executive Committee shall specify those activities to be administered by the General Manager.

- 6. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for management of IEEE Headquarters. The Executive Committee shall prepare and present an annual budget the Board of Directors for approval.
- 7. The Executive Committee shall be charged with broad considering IEEE policies and making appropriate recommendations to the Board of Directors on its initiative.
- 8. The Executive Committee shall appoint, direct and coordinate the work of all Standing Administrative Committees except those appointed directly by the Board of Directors.
- 9. The Executive Committee shall approve or disapprove of formation, dissolution and operation of groups of bers except the dissolution of Sections and the alternation of Regional boundaries.
- 10. The Executive Committee may authorize conventions, conferences and meetings of the IEEE and approve that dates and locations.
- 11. The publication of IEEE Standards shall be subject the approval of the Executive Committee.
- 12. The Executive Committee shall establish an office account, which must be specifically limited in another the funds for which shall be made available from the funds received by the IEEE by authorization of at least two Corporate Officers, as provided in the Constitution of the shall be withdrawn from the office account only by authorized bonded employees of the IEEE.
- 13. Five members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 14. The Executive Committee may select and authorize the execution of contracts with an investment advisor, and may provide that the investment advisor shall have the cretionary authority over IEEE's investment portfole

#### 303. Corporate Officers

- As provided in the Constitution, the Corporate Office of the IEEE shall be the President, the three Vice Presidents, the Secretary, and the Treasurer, a total of six. Corporate Officers shall be of Fellow or Senior Member grade.
- 2. As provided in the Constitution, the President shall be elected by the voting members, by virtue of which elected he shall also be a Delegate-at-Large and a Director-at-Large. His term as President shall be one year. His term as Delegate-at-Large and Director-at-Large shall be tone years.
- 3. There shall be three Vice Presidents of the IEEE. Come of these shall be elected by the voting members for a term of office of one year, by virtue of which election he shall also be a Delegate-at-Large and a Director-Large. He shall be Chairman of the Sections Committee The other Vice Presidents shall be elected by the Assembly, for a term of one year, by virtue of which election they shall also be Directors. One of the Will Presidents elected by the Assembly shall be designate "Vice President - Technical Activities" and shall be Chairman of the Technical Activities Board. The other Vice President elected by the Assembly shall be design nated "Vice President - Publication Activities" and shall be Chairman of the Publications Board. The three Vice Presidents shall serve as coordinators of their respective activities on the Executive Committee.
- 4. The Vice President elected by the voting members shall take precedence as regards assumption of presidential duties as provided in the Constitution.
- 5. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected by the annual Assembly, by virtue of which election they also be Directors. The terms of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be one year and their terms as Directors shall also be one year.

- Reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses is authorized for the Corporate Officers, incurred in authorized for their IEEE duties over and above the performance of their duties as Delegates or Directors.

- A vacancy among the Corporate Officers and the duration thereof shall be determined by the Board of Directors which may fill such vacancy as provided by the Constitution. If a vacancy occurs among the Corporate Officers at a time when it is not feasible to convene a meeting of the Board of Directors and there is need for action, the Executive Committee that is need for action, the Executive Committee shall make such determination and fill such vacancy if the approval of a majority of all the Directors is secured by mail or telephone, such approval to be recorded by the Secretary with the names of the approving Directors.
- The Secretary shall prepare an Annual Report on membership, meetings and IEEE activities, to be submitted to the Board of Directors.
- 10. The Treasurer shall cause to be prepared an annual audit of the affairs of the IEEE by certified public accountants and a report thereof submitted to the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall also make a report to the Executive Committee semi-annually concerning the status of the IEEE investments. The Treasurer, before making changes in the IEEE portfolio, shall report the proposed changes to the Executive Committee and obtain its approval.

#### . Boards and Committees

- The activities of the IEEE shall be conducted wherever possible through voluntarily associated groups of members organized by (1) geographic area (i.e. Sections, etc.) and (2) field of interest (i.e. Groups). To provide for activities of the IEEE not adequately fulfilled by the voluntarily associated groups, committees of members shall be appointed by the Board of Directors or by the Executive Committee.
- The following Boards and Committees shall be appointed by and be responsible to the Board of Directors:

- 3. Each Board and Standing Committee shall have the right to create subcommittees of its own selection. Voting members of all Boards, Standing Committees and subcommittees thereof shall be members of the IEEE. Qualified individuals who are not members of IEEE may serve as nonvoting consultants to these bodies.
- 4. Term of Appointment. Unless specified otherwise, the term of appointment for members, including the Chairman and any other officers of the above Boards and Standing Committees shall be for the calendar year of appointment. However, acceptance of appointment will carry with it the understanding that a member would normally be reappointed annually to serve for no more than three consecutive years dependent on continued active participation and current requirements.
- 5. <u>Duration of Service</u>. Unless specified otherwise, the consecutive period of service of any member of any Board or Standing Committee listed in Bylaw 304.2 shall not extend beyond three years, except that a Chairman or Past Chairman may serve one additional year. The limitations of tenure may be waived in individual cases for reasons deemed by the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee to be in the best interests of the Institute.
- 6. <u>Distribution of Appointments</u>. Unless specified otherwise, appointments shall normally be distributed so as to avoid the termination of more than about one-third of the membership of any Board or Standing Committee in any calendar year.
- 7. Additional appointments may be made to any Board or Standing Committee to fill vacancies or to care for special cases as the need arises, but such appointments shall expire with the expiration of the calendar year.
- 8. The functions, scopes and responsibilities of each Committee, together with rules for operation and guidance, as recommended by the Committee, shall be compiled by the General Manager for the approval of the Executive Committee and contained in a document titled "Committee Manual." Following appointment, each new member of a Committee shall be provided with a copy of the applicable Manual.
- The Board of Directors may appoint or direct the appointment of representatives of the IEEE on joint committees, boards and other local, national and international bodies.

#### 305. IEEE Awards Activities

#### 1. Awards Board.

Composition of the Awards Board. The Awards Board shall consist of fourteen members: the Chairman, Vice Chairman, four members-at-large, and the Chairmen of the following eight Committees of the Awards Board:

Edison Medal Field Awards
Founders Award Scholarship Awards
Lamme Medal IEEE Prize Papers
IEEE Education Medal External Awards

Appointments to the Awards Board. The IEEE Board of Directors shall make all appointments to the Awards Board. The Chairman shall be a member of the IEEE Board of Directors. All vacancies shall be filled by interim appointments, as required, to bring the Awards Board to fourteen members.

Appointments to the Committees of the Awards Board. The members other than the Chairmen of the Committees of the Awards Board shall be recommended by the Awards Board and appointed by the IEEE Executive Committee. The number of members on the Awards Board Committees and guidelines for the rotation of committee members shall be specified in the Manual of the Awards Board. At least one member of the Board of Directors shall serve as a member of each of the Major Annual Awards Committees.

Responsibilities of the Awards Board. The Awards Board shall review annually the awards activities of the IEEE and shall recommend to the Board of Directors such changes as it deems desirable. Beginning in 1969 and thereafter during the last year of each decade, the Awards Board shall critically review each individual IEEE award and shall recommend to the Board of Directors the continuation, or modification in name, scope or intent of each IEEE award included in the Bylaws at that time.

2. IEEE Medal of Honor. The Medal of Honor is the highest IEEE award for a singular achievement in the fields of science and technology. It will be awarded only when a candidate is identified as meeting the exceptional requirements of the award and not on a regular annual basis.

The Medal of Honor shall be awarded to a candidate (not necessarily a member of the IEEE) who shall have made an exceptional contribution to the fields of science and technology defined in Article I of the IEEE Constitution.

The Awards Board, as a Committee of the Whole, shall recommend candidates for the IEEE Medal of Honor to the Board of Directors.

Major Annual Awards. There shall be four IEEE Major Annual Awards. These will be awarded annually when in the judgment of the Awards Board suitable candidates are available. Recipients of the IEEE Major Annual Awards shall be members of IEEE, except that, under exceptional circumstances, the Board of Directors may approve the presentation of any of the IEEE Major Annual Awards to a nonmember. The IEEE Major Annual Awards are:

Edison Medal. The Edison Medal shall be the principal annual award of the IEEE, and shall be awarded to a candidate for a career of meritorious achievement in electrical science or electrical engineering or the electrical arts.

Founders Award. The Founders Award is given for major contributions in the leadership, planning, and administration of affairs of great value to the electrical and electronics engineering

Lamme Medal. The Lamme Medal shall be the principal annual award for meritorious achievement in the development of electrical or electronic apparatus or systems.

IEEE Education Medal. The IEEE Education Medal shall be awarded to recognize outstanding contributions to education.

The designated committee of the Awards Board shall review all nominations and select a candidate to recommend for each of the four Major Annual Awards. Candidates for these Awards shall be approved by the Awards Board before submission to the Board of Directors for final approval.

4. Field Awards. The IEEE Field Awards are awarded for contributions in several fields of science and technology and in particular classes of service. They are awarded annually when in the judgment of the Awards Board suitable candidates are available. The Field Awards are:

Harry Diamond Award, for outstanding technical contributions in the government service.

William M. Habirshaw Award, in the field of trainsion and distribution of electric power.

IEEE Award in International Communication, in

Mervin J. Kelly Award, in the field of telecommunication

Morris E. Leeds Award, in the field of electrical measurements.

Morris N. Liebmann Award, in the field of radio.

David Sarnoff Award, in the field of electronics

Vladimir K. Zworykin Award, in the field of electronic television.

The Field Awards Committee of the Awards Board shall administer and recommend candidates for these awards

- 5. Scholarship Awards. The IEEE Scholarship Awards are the Fortescue Fellowship Award and the Volta Scholarship Award. These, together with other scholarships or fellowships as may be established by the Board of Directors, are administered by the Scholarship Awards Committee.
- 6. IEEE Prize Papers. The IEEE Prize Paper Awards are.

W.R.G.Baker Award. This is presented annually for the best paper originating in any of the IEEE TRANSACTIONS.

Browder J. Thompson Award. This is presented annually for the best paper in any IEEE publication by an author or joint authors under thirty years of age.

IEEE Student Prize Paper Award. This is presented annually for the best paper by an IEEE Student member or members, selected from the winners of the Regional Prize Papers Contests.

These Prize Paper Awards shall be administered by the Prize Papers Committee of the Awards Board.

The Awards Board shall have policy supervision over all Prize Paper Awards of the IEEE, but may delegate responsibility for administration, selection of candidate and presentation of Prize Paper Awards, other than those listed in this Bylaw, to the appropriate Standing Committee as follows: Student Prize Papers to the Student Branches Committee; Group Prize Papers to the Committees of the Groups; Section, Council, and Regional Prize Papers to the Sections Committee.

7. External Awards. External Awards are those awards not exclusive to IEEE but of interest to IEEE and its members

The Committee on External Awards shall be responsible for reviewing and suggesting action on outside sources of awards of interest to IEEE members, for recommending nominations for such external awards as may be assigned to it by the Awards Board, and for cooperation with the Intersociety Relations Committee in the selection of IEEE nominees to serve on joint society medals and awards committees.

- 8. Authority for Awards. The IEEE awards administered by the Awards Board and its committees shall be presented with the approval of, and in the name of, the IEEE Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may delegate its authority to the Executive Committee for the approval of Scholarship and Fellowship Awards and for other specific awards except the Medal of Honor and the IEEE Major Annual Awards.
- 9. Procedure for Nomination and Selection of Candidates.
  Except as expressly provided in these Bylaws, the procedure for the nomination and selection of candidates for awards shall be specified in the Manual of the Awards Board. No member of the Board of Directors, the Awards Board or the Headquarters Staff shall act as a sponsor or reference for any nomination for which the Awards Board is responsible, if he occupies any of these positions on the date of submission of the nomination or reference form.

10. Presentation of IEEE Awards. The Medal of Honor and the IEEE Major Annual Awards shall be presented during the IEEE International Convention. All other awards shall be presented at the time and places awards shall be presented at the time and places approved by the IEEE Executive Committee, with the approved by the Awards Board. The Chairman of the advice of the Awards Board. The Chairman of the Awards Board shall be responsible for the review Awards Board of plans and arrangements for the and approval of plans and arrangements for the presentation of IEEE Awards as well as for the format and content of IEEE Awards brochures.

# 96. Publications Board

- 1. The Publications Board shall coordinate the technical publication activities of the IEEE. It shall consist of the Vice President Publication Activities as of the Vice President Publication Activities as Chairman, a Vice Chairman, the Editor of the IEEE SPECTRUM, the Editor of the PROCEEDINGS OF THE IEEE, the Editor of the IEEE STUDENT JOURNAL, two Group Editors, and not fewer than three nor more than six other members. The Staff Secretary of the Publications Board and any other members of the Headquarters Staff designated by the Vice President Publication Activities and the General Manager shall serve as ax-officio, nonvoting members.
- 2. The Publications Board shall be responsible for the formulation and recommendation of publication policies to the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors, the establishment of such criteria and procedures as are appropriate for ensuring the adequacy and excellence of the publications of the IEEE, and the relationship between IEEE publications and other technical journals.
- The following committees and boards shall be appointed by and be responsible to the Publications Board:

Editorial Board, IEEE SPECTRUM
Editorial Board, PROCEEDINGS OF THE IEEE
Editorial Board, IEEE STUDENT JOURNAL
Information Processing Committee
Translated Journals Committee

- 4. The Editors of IEEE SPECTRUM, PROCEEDINGS OF THE IEEE, and the IEEE STUDENT JOURNAL shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. Each Editor shall be Chairman of the Editorial Board of his respective publication. The Vice President Publication Activities may authorize the reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses incurred by the Editors of IEEE SPECTRUM, PROCEEDINGS OF THE IEEE, and IEEE STUDENT JOURNAL, in the performance of their duties as Editors.
- 5. There shall be a Panel of Technical Publication Editors consisting of the editors of IEEE SPECTRUM, PROCEEDINGS OF THE IEEE, IEEE STUDENT JOURNAL and the TRANSACTIONS and JOURNALS of the Groups. A member of the Publications Board shall be Chairman. The Panel of Technical Publication Editors shall provide a means for coordinating publication activities and for assisting the Publications Board in determining publication policy recommendations.

## 307. Technical Activities Board

1. There shall be a Technical Activities Board (TAB) which shall administer those technical activities assigned to it by the IEEE Executive Committee, and the TAB shall report to the Executive Committee. It shall consist of the Chairman of each Group, each TAB General Committee, the Vice President - Technical Activities elected by the annual Assembly, and the Secretary of TAB, all ex officio; and Membersat-Large and ad hoc appointments by the Chairman of TAB with the approval of the IEEE Executive Committee.

The Chairman of TAB shall be the IEEE Vice President-Technical Activities elected by the annual Assembly, and he shall be a member of the IEEE Executive Committee. (See 302.2) There shall be a Vice Chairman of TAB appointed by the IEEE Executive Committee. Neither the Chairman nor the Vice Chairman shall be an officer of any entity under the jurisdiction of the TAB. The Secretary shall be a member of the IEEE Headquarters Staff designated by the General Manager.

- 2. The Technical Activities Board shall formulate and recommend to the IEEE Executive Committee policies, organizational arrangements, scopes of Groups and TAB General Committees and remaining Technical Operations Committee entities; and programs for the establishment, development, conduct, and appraisal of IEEE technical activities. It shall supervise and coordinate the work of all Groups and TAB General Committees under regulations approved by the IEEE Executive Committee and published in a Technical Activities Manual for the guidance of all concerned.
- To expedite TAB's function, a small Operating Committee, composed of TAB members, shall meet as often as necessary to act on matters as authorized by TAB. This Operating Committee is an ancillary agent of TAB.

The Operating Committee shall consist of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of TAB, and other members of TAB, including liaison members representing Publications, Financial and Regional IEEE functions but without vote, as recommended by TAB and appointed by the Executive Committee. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and Secretary of the Operating Committee shall be those individuals holding respectively the same offices in TAB.

The Operating Committee shall act for, and under the direction of, the Technical Activities Board in the management of the technical activities of IEEE. It shall have such powers and authority as may properly, from time to time, be delegated to it by TAB; and such duties as shall be prescribed in the Technical Activities Manual.

 There shall be the following General Committees of TAB, the officers and members to be appointed by TAB:

New Technical and Scientific Activities Research Safety Standards

5. The Standards Committee shall consist of not more than 26 Institute members, including a Chairman, a Vice Chairman, and the immediate Past Chairman, plus a Secretariat assigned from the Headquarters Staff.

The Committee is responsible on an Institute-wide basis for encouraging and coordinating the work of formulating and revising IEEE Standards. The Committee gives final approval to IEEE Standards prior to submission to the Executive Committee for publication. It considers and investigates all matters relating to units and standards in the fields of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences. It represents the IEEE in cooperation with other standardizing bodies in matters relating to units and standards.

The Standards Committee shall be empowered to establish and appoint subcommittees (such as Standards Coordinating Committee).

6. The New Technical and Scientific Activities Committee shall consist of not more than 20 Institute members including a Chairman, four Vice Chairmen, a Secretary and the immediate Past Chairman. A Vice Chairman shall head each of the following committees: Advisory, Basic Sciences, Liaison, and New and Specialized Technologies. The activities of each of these committees shall fall within the scope of the parent Committee.

The Committee shall be particularly concerned with the seeking out at an early stage and the promotion of TEEE interests in new developments in the broad field of electrical engineering and those areas of other branches of the sciences and engineering in which applications of interest or importance to the electrical field are developing. It shall perform a staff function for TAB, investigate and promote through its own members, activities in these fields until the areas of technical interest crystallize into recognizable scopes, then recommend to TAB an appropriate permanent technical organization for the new activity in existing, modified, or new Groups. The Committee by itself or in cooperation with existing Groups or other Societies, shall, keeping TAB informed, encourage and promote reports, publications, sessions, conferences and meetings as may seem most appropriate for developing the position of IEEE in the new fields.

 The Research Committee shall consist of not more than 20 Institute members, including a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, and immediate Past Chairman.

The Research Committee shall be concerned with all aspects of research of interest to the Institute and shall serve to stimulate, coordinate, and support, as required and authorized, these interests. It will perform a staff function for TAB which will include: (1) encourage and assist Groups, in their respective fields, continuously to identify, evaluate, and report research needs and progress, and to stimulate research activity in areas of apparent need; (2) provide reports and recommendations on the IEEE positions regarding research; (3) recommend means of optimizing IEEE cooperation with appropriate governmental, industrial, and educational institutions and agencies concerned with research of interest to IEEE; (4) suggest appropriate IEEE representation in cooperative interdisciplinary research studies or activities involving other Societies or special study groups when electrical or electronic interests are involved; (5) assess methods and procedures for optimum performance of research including integration, evaluation, and balancing of research with development, production and distribution activities, and evaluate the current status of research planning and progress in industry and government; and (6) encourage and promote reports, publications, sessions and meetings at various levels to evaluate programs or present recommendations regarding opportunities, needs or deficiencies in research efforts.

 The Safety Committee shall consist of not more than 15 Institute members including a Chairman, a Vice Chairman, a Secretary, and the immediate Past Chairman.

The Committee shall act in an advisory capacity to TAB in matters relating to the protection of persons and property against hazard due to or resulting from the presence of electricity or the use of electric and electronic apparatus, material and appliances, and report such recommendations thereon as it deems desirable for action by the IEEE.

#### 308. Standing Committees

1. Admission and Advancement Committee. The Admission and Advancement Committee shall be responsible for advising the Executive Committee as to the admission and transfer of applicants to the professional grades of Senior Member and Member. It shall be concerned with determining whether the applicants meet the requirements of the Constitution and the Bylaws, functioning primarily as a Jury and acting as a guardian of the membership standards of the IEEE. As far as possible, its meetings shall be held just prior to the scheduled meetings of the Executive Committee in the interest of expediting the processing of applications.

Applications for the grade of Associate and Student shall be handled by IREE Headquarters and periodic reports shall be made to the Executive Committee by the General Manager.

Members of the Admission and Advancement Committee shall be of Fellow or Senior Member grade.

2. Education Committee. The Education Committee shall be a policy advisory committee and, when appropriate, an operating committee for the IEEE in the field of education and shall report to the Executive Committee at periodic intervals concerning the status of and proposals affecting that field. These reports shall be circulated to the members of the Board of Directors. The Committee shall study the needs for education in electrical and electronics engineering and the allied sciences in industrial and government organizations and in universities, colleges, technical institutes and high schools, to determine recommended actions to be undertaken by the Institute. The Committee shall seek contributions to the formulation of policy recommendations from the Groups and Technical Committees, encouraging them to provide for exchange of information through seminars and publications and for discussion of education philosophy, problems and methods.

The Education Committee shall consist of not more than sixteen members, of which not more than twelve are to be appointed by the Executive Committee, and

four ex-officio members. Appointees shall be chosen on the basis of their usefulness to specific subcommittees of the Education Committee. The ex-office of the IEEE Group on Education, and one of the IEEE Group on Education and Accreditation Committee of the ECPD, all with voting privileges of the Chairman of the Electrical Engineering Division of ASEE may also be appointed an ex-officio members and the Education committee shall maintain liaison with the Publications Board.

3. Fellow Committee. The Fellow Committee shall be responsible for making recommendations to the Board of Directors for nominees to be conferred the grade of Fellow. The Committee shall also provide a citation for each such nominee. The recommendations may not exceed a total of one hundred twenty-five in any one year. Sources from which nominations of candidates and other useful information shall be obtained shall be set forth in the Fellow Manual.

No member of the Board of Directors, the Fellow Committee or the Headquarters Staff shall act as sponsor or reference for any nomination for Fellow grade, if he occupies any of these positions on the date of submission of the nomination or reference form.

The Fellow Committee shall consist of sixteen members chosen from among those of Fellow grade, ten being selected so that each of Regions 1 to 10 inclusive will have representation.

4. Finance Committee. The Finance Committee shall be responsible for periodically reviewing the fiscal affairs of the IEEE concerning which it is to take the initiative for making recommendations to the Executive Committee when warranted. It shall review the annual budget in advance of its submission to the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors.

The Finance Committee shall consist of not more than five members of the Board of Directors and shall include the Treasurer as Chairman.

5. <u>History Committee</u>. The History Committee shall be responsible for considering questions concerning historical matters in the fields covered by IEEE activities, including assistance to the Publications Board, assisting institutions of a public nature such as the Smithsonian Institution where helpful information is requested and can be secured, and for providing information and recommendations to the Executive Committee when pertinent.

The History Committee shall consist of not more than fifteen members, who shall be chosen for knowledge of and interest in technological history.

- 6. Internal Communications Committee. The Internal Communications Committee shall be responsible for review of generic internal communications among the membership, officers, headquarters and organizational units of the Institute and for the provision of assistance, advice and recommendations to appropriate units for improvements in such communications. It shall also advise the Executive Committee and General Manager in public relations matters. The Committee shall consist of not more than six members.
- Intersociety Relations Committee. The Intersociety Relations Committee reports to the Board of Directors and is responsible for the following:

Advising the Board on matters of policy with respect to intersociety affairs.

Representing the IEEE in negotiations of new intersociety relations.

Formulating methods for the application of IEEE policy to intersociety problems.

promoting the implementation of IEEE policies and programs in the field of intersociety relations.

carrying out any related activity assigned to the Committee by the Board of Directors.

The Intersociety Relations Committee shall consist of nine members appointed by the Board of Directors. of nine members appointed by the Board of Directors. Experience with the major federation and intersociety experience with the major federation and intersociety experience with the extent feasible, be represented groups membership of the Committee. The Chairman for in the membership of the Committee by the President alendar year is designated by the President for that year.

8. Life Member Fund Committee. The Life Member Fund Committee shall administer a "Life Member Fund" carried on the accounts of IEEE, made up of contributions by Life Members and to which contributions may be made in the future. The purposes for which the fund may be used and withdrawals therefrom shall be under the control of the Life Member pund Committee.

The Life Member Fund Committee shall consist of eight members. At least four shall be contributors to the fund and at least one shall be a member of the Board of Directors.

Membership and Transfers Committee. The Membership and Transfers Committee shall plan and develop methods of extending the membership of IEEE and promoting transfers in grade to the end that all members shall occupy the highest grade for which they are qualified.

The Membership and Transfers Committee shall consist of one representative from each Region and members-at-large, all appointed by the Executive Committee on recommendation of the Vice President elected by the voting members.

Nominations and Appointments Committee. The Nominations and Appointments Committee shall recommend candidates for office to the annual Assembly. At least fourteen days before the next annual Assembly, the Nominations and Appointments Committee shall mail to the Delegates whose terms continue through the following year and to the new Delegates-elect, a list of candidates for the offices of two Vice Presidents, Director for Region 10, Secretary, Treasurer, and Directors to be elected by the annual Assembly.

A list of candidates to fill vacancies expected to exist among the chairman and members of the Fellow, Intersociety Relations, Life Member Fund, Nominations and Appointments and Tellers Committees and the Awards and Publications Boards for the ensuing year shall be submitted to the Board of Directors for appointment at the first meeting of the Board of Directors held after January 1.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee shall submit names of candidates for the Executive Committee to the Board of Directors for appointment at the Annual Meeting, and shall carry out the other provisions of these Bylaws relating to nominations and appointments.

The membership of the Nominations and Appointments Committee shall be chosen from among those members of the Board of Directors whose terms continue through the following year and shall include two Directors who are currently serving the first year of their terms. Its membership may additionally include not more than two junior past Regional Directors.

For the term beginning January 1, 1967 and ending December 31, 1967, this Committee shall recommend a candidate to the annual Assembly for the office of Director of Region 9. Thereafter, this office shall be filled by ballot, as provided in Bylaw 201.1.

11. Professional Relations Committee. The Professional Relations Committee shall be responsible for keeping the Executive Committee informed on matters relating to Registration of Engineers, Professional Conduct and Ethics.

The Professional Relations Committee shall consist of not more than ten members, who shall be chosen for special qualifications in this field.

12. Sections Committee. The Sections Committee deals with problems and activities involving the interest and welfare of the Sections, their relations with the IEEE and with other organizations. It shall, when appropriate, make recommendations to the Executive Committee regarding Section affairs.

The Sections Committee shall consist of not less than twenty members, and its Chairman shall be the Vice President elected by the voting members. The IEEE Regional Directors shall be ex-officio members of this Committee, with voting privileges.

13. Student Branches Committee. The Student Branches Committee shall be responsible to the Executive Committee for evolving recommendations regarding Student Branches of the IEEE and problems of individual Student members having no Student Branch affiliation. The Student Branches Committee may make recommendations to the Publications Board with respect to the content of the Student publication.

Administration of an Outstanding Student Branch Award shall be the responsibility of the Student Branches Committee.

The Student Branches Committee shall include the Chairmen of the Regional Student Activities Committees.

14. Tellers Committee. The Tellers Committee, consisting of not more than ten members, shall be responsible to the Board of Directors for the supervision of the counting of ballots required to be obtained by the Constitution on questions submitted to the membership of IEEE or to groups of members. Reports by the Committee to the Board of Directors shall be signed by the Chairman of the Committee.

#### 309. General Manager and Headquarters Staff

- The Executive Committee shall appoint a General Manager and shall fix his tenure of office and determine his salary.
- 2. The General Manager serves as the executive officer of the IEEE, shall be in charge of IEEE Headquarters, its staff and operations, and shall be custodian of all property and equipment owned and used by the IEEE, for which he shall be responsible to the Executive Committee.
- He shall, under the supervision of the Secretary, direct such of the functions as are necessary for meeting the responsibilities assigned to the Secretary.
- 4. He shall cooperate with the Finance Committee and, under the supervision of the Treasurer, execute IEEE fiscal policies and operations.
- He shall cooperate with the Publications Board and, under the direction of the Vice President - Publication Activities, administer IEEE publication activities.
- He shall assist the Tellers Committee in the performance of its work.
- He shall attend such meetings of the IEEE, its units and related bodies, as may be required in the discharge of his duties.
- 8. Neither the General Manager nor any other member of the Headquarters Staff shall have any vote by reason of membership on any IEEE Committee.

#### 310. Nominations and Elections

- The Secretary shall circularize appropriate organizational units before March first of each year inviting the submission of suitable names to be considered by the Nominations and Appointments Committee for the various elective offices.
- 2. The Nominations and Appointments Committee shall submit the name or names of one or more candidates for the office of President and for the office of the Vice President to be elected by the voting members and the names of more than one candidate for each of the other elective offices.
- 3. The Nominations and Appointments Committee shall transmit its list of proposed nominees to all Directors in time to permit the Board to fulfill the requirements of Article XII of the IEEE Constitution.
- 4. Each Regional Committee shall submit to the Board of Directors by April thirtieth of the Regional election year, the names of at least one qualified nominee for the office of Regional Delegate-Regional Director. To qualify, each candidate shall indicate to the Regional Committee his acceptance of the nomination.
- 5. Nominations by petition for the office of Regional Delegate-Regional Director may be made by the submission, by the date stated and according to the procedure outlined in the Constitution, of a petition signed by at least one-third of one percent of the total number of voting members residing within the Region, as listed in the official membership records of the IEEE at the end of the previous year, but in no case shall the number be less than one hundred.
- During the period between August fourteenth and September first of each year, the Executive Committee is authorized to take any necessary actions on any petitions and to approve the ballot.
- Each proposed nominee named by the Board of Directors shall be consulted, and, if he so requests, his name shall be withdrawn.
- 8. The list of nominees required to be submitted to all voting members by the Constitution shall contain at least one name for the office of President, at least one name for the office of Vice President to be elected by the voting members and at least four names for the two offices of Delegate-at-Large/Director-at-Large.

The ballot going to each of the Regions where an election of a Regional Delegate-Regional Director is to take place shall contain at least one name for the office of Regional Delegate-Regional Director for that particular Region.

For those cases where more than one candidate is on the ballot for any single office, the names shall be arranged in alphabetical order and the ballot shall carry a statement to the effect that the order of the names is alphabetical for convenience only and indicates no preference.

9. Voting members shall vote for the candidates whose names appear on the list of nominees, by written ballots in plain sealed envelopes, enclosed within mailing envelopes marked "Ballot" and bearing the member's written signature. No ballots within unsigned outer envelopes shall be counted. Only ballots arriving at IEEE Headquarters before twelve o'clock noon on the first working day following October thirty-first shall be counted. Ballots shall be checked, opened and

counted under the supervision of the Tellers
Committee not later than the fifth working day
following the above-stated date for closing the
ballot. The result of the count shall be reported to the Board of Directors at its next
succeeding meeting and the nominee for each
office for which the election is being held,
receiving the greatest number of qualified votes
shall be declared elected. In the event of a tie
vote, the Board of Directors shall choose between

#### 311. Pension Benefit Plan

1. The IEEE shall have a Pension Benefit Plan for its full-time paid employees, operated under the control of the Executive Committee.

#### 312. Amendments

- 1. Before an amendment to the Constitution is submitted to the voting members, it shall be reviewed by lead counsel designated by the Executive Committee
- 2. Ballots for Constitutional amendments shall carry a statement of the time limit for return to IRER Headquarters. The ballots after marking shall be placed in plain sealed envelopes, enclosed within mailing envelopes marked "Ballot" and bearing the member's written signature. Only ballots with signed outer envelopes shall be counted Only ballots arriving at IEEE Headquarters prior to the stated time limit shall be counted. The votes will be counted under the supervision of the Tellers Committee and the results reported to the Board of Directors at its next meeting.
- 3. As provided in the Constitution, proposed Bylaw changes and the reasons therefor shall be mailed to all Directors at least twenty days before the stipulated meeting of the Board of Directors at which the vote shall be taken. Two-thirds of the votes of the members present at the meeting shall be required to approve any new Bylaw, amendment or revocation.
- A complete history of amendments shall be kept in the files of the IEEE.

#### 313. Fiscal Year

1. The fiscal year for IEEE shall be the calendar year

### 401. Regions

- 1. The United States of America shall be divided into six Regions. The territory comprising Canada shall be Region 7. The territory comprising Europe and certain portions of the Near East and Northern Africa shall be Region 8. Effective January 1, 1967, the territory comprising the Caribbean and Bahama Islands, South America, Central America and North America (except the United States and Canada) shall be designated Region 9. Areas not included in Regions 1 through 9 shall be designated Region 10. The boundaries of the Regions shall be established by the Board of Directors.
- 2. When new Regions are established, or when changes are made in Regional boundaries, the changes shall be made effective so that no Regional Delegate-Regional Director shall have his term shortened by such changes.
- Regions failing to maintain reasonable activity
  may be dissolved and the Sections therein may be
  absorbed into other Regions, the boundaries of
  which are to be correspondingly altered.

gach Region except Region 10 shall have a Regional Committee which shall consist of at least the Committee which shall consist of at least the Regional Director, one representative of each Regional Student Activities Committee. The Section Regional Student Activities Committee. The Section Regional Student Activities Committee at a Regional tion. A Section may be represented at a Regional committee meeting by an alternate appointed by committee meeting by an alternate appointed by the Section Executive Committee with notification to the Regional Director. Region 10 may have a Regional Committee.

In the case where a Region contains Councils, the Regional Committee may include, in addition to the above, a representative of each Council of the Region. Such representatives shall have no vote.

- The Regional Committee may include additional voting members from such entities as Sections, Membership and Transfers Committees and the Technical Activities Board, not exceeding in number one-fourth of the above mandatory number of members representing the Sections in the Region. The purpose for such additional members shall be determined by the Regional Committee based upon each Region's individual requirements. Such additional members shall be appointed on a year-to-year basis by the Regional Director, subject to the approval of the Regional Committee.
- 6. Each member of the Regional Committee shall be of Member, Senior Member or Fellow grade in the IEEE. The term of office of each member other than the Regional Director and the junior past Regional Director shall be one year concurrent with the term of office of the Section Officers. Vacancies, except for Regional Director, shall be filled by appointment of the Section Executive Committee in which the vacancy exists.
- 7. The Regional Committee shall hold at least one meeting each year, at an appropriate time and place within the Region. A quorum for a Regional Committee meeting shall consist of a majority of the members of the Committee or their alternates and shall include representatives from at least half of the Sections in the Region. The Regional Director or, in the event of his unavailability, a Regional Committee Vice Chairman, shall be responsible for calling the necessary number of Regional Committee meetings and designation of the places of meeting. Under exceptional circumstances, the Executive Committee may authorize such meeting, for each specific instance, to be held without the Region.
- 8. The duties of the Regional Committee shall include the making of at least one nomination for Regional Delegate-Regional Director for its Region during election years, participation in the development of the IEEE by means of suggestions on Institute-wide matters to the Executive Committee and on Regional and Sectional matters to the Sections comprising the Region, except that in the case of Region 10 the Regional Committee, if any, may make a recommendation to the IEEE Board of Directors for a nominee for Regional Director for the ensuing term.
- 9. The Regional Director shall be Chairman of the Regional Committee and shall appoint a Vice Chairman from among the membership of the Committee. The Chairman of the Regional Committee shall appoint a Secretary-Treasurer from among the membership of the Region for a two-year term concurrent with that of the Chairman. The duties of the Secretary-Treasurer shall include correspondence, the keeping of the minutes of the Committee meetings, mailing notices, handling of funds, the keeping of financial records, the submission of a report to the Executive Committee at the end of each year to be sent to the General Manager, and such other duties as are assigned to him by the Chairman. The Secretary-Treasurer shall not be a voting member of the Committee unless specifically so appointed for a term of one year by the Regional Director, subject to the approval of the Regional Committee.

- 10. Pending installation of the first Regional Director of a Region, the President of the IEEE shall appoint a Chairman pro tem of the Regional Committee, with the approval of the Executive Committee, and the Chairman pro tem shall appoint a Secretary-Treasurer pro tem.
- 11. Each Region shall establish a Regional Student Activities Committee to be responsible to the Regional Committee. It shall be concerned with the encouragement of student activities in the Region including Student member and Student Branch operations, general supervision of student activities and meetings when held on a Regional basis, and the fostering and coordination of educational activities with the Sections. The Regional Student Activities Committee shall be composed of all Counselors in the Region and any Student Branches Committee members residing in the Region, ex officio. The Chairman of this Committee shall be appointed from the membership of the Regional Student Activities Committee by the Regional Director, and he shall have a term of office to correspond with that of the Regional Director.
- 12. Each Regional Committee shall conduct its activities within the Constitution, Bylaws and other rules externally imposed which by law affect the membership and activities of the IEEE. Regions shall have the right to obligate their funds for all purposes necessary to promote their objectives except that no Region or any officer or representative thereof shall have any authority to contract debts for, pledge the credit of, or in any way bind the IEEE for those activities specifically prohibited in the Manual for Regions.
- 13. Partial reimbursement as authorized by the Executive Committee of actual and necessary expenses will be provided to attend one Regional Committee meeting each year for those authorized to attend.

The Executive Committee, in determining the amount of such reimbursement, shall take into account circumstances which may affect Sections of small size or which are remotely located. Under exceptional circumstances, the Executive Committee may provide for partial reimbursement for more than one meeting per year.

- 14. Effective January 1, 1967, an allowance of \$1.10 shall be paid annually to the Treasury of the Regional Committee in lieu of payment to a Section, for each member above Student grade, whose residence, as of December 31 of the previous year, is within the Region, but not within the boundary of any Section within the Region.
- 15. The Executive Committee may authorize by establishing a formula or policy statement within the limits of funds budgeted by the Board of Directors for this purpose, the reimbursement of actual and necessary travel expenses to attend one meeting per year by members of certain of the Standing Boards and Committees listed in Bylaw 304 residing in Regions 8, 9 and 10. The amount and distribution of such reimbursement shall be decided in consultation with the respective Regional Directors.
- 16. Subject to budget limits approved by the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee may authorize the transfer of funds, for development of IEEE activities in Regions 8, 9 and 10, to the respective Regional treasuries, the amounts and purposes thereof to be decided in consultation with the respective Regional Directors.

#### 402. Sections

 There shall be established throughout the territory in which IEEE conducts operations, groups of members residing in specified geographical areas designated as Sections.

Section affiliation shall be determined by the member's mailing address.

- 2. All Sections shall be exclusively those of the IEEE. Management of an IEEE Section shall be exclusively by IEEE members and not jointly with members of any other organization, society, or group. However, IEEE Sections may cooperate with other organizations in holding of joint meetings and may invite members of such organizations and the public to their meetings.
- 3. The Board of Directors may dissolve any Section for any reason deemed sufficient by the Board of Directors and any remaining funds and assets in the custody of that Section shall revert to the IEEE.
- 4. A petition for the formation of a Section shall be signed by not fewer than fifty members other than Students, having mailing addresses within the territorial limits proposed in the petition. The Executive Committee, acting on a petition bearing fewer than fifty names, may authorize the formation of a Section, especially when there is assurance that the formation of the Section will stimulate sufficient additional support. The territorial limits of the proposed Section shall be specifically delineated in the petition. The petition shall also list the concurring and, nonconcurring Sections that are involved in the territory concerned.
- 5. The Executive Committee, upon receipt of a petition for the creation of a Section containing the recommendation of the Regional Director and those of any Sections that may be involved in changes of their territory, may authorize its formation. Each Section so authorized shall abide by the standard Constitution for Sections and shall within no longer than a six-months period adopt Section Bylaws consistent with requirements set forth in the Constitution for Sections. After the Section is organized and Section Bylaws have been adopted, the Executive Committee may give final approval to its establishment.
- 6. Each Section shall conduct its activities within the Constitution, Bylaws, Section Manuals and other rules externally imposed which by law affect the membership and activities of the IEEE.
- 7. Sections shall have the right to obligate their funds for all purposes necessary to promote their objectives except that no Section or any officer or representative thereof shall have any authority to contract debts for, pledge the credit of, or in any way bind the IEEE for those activities specifically prohibited in the Manual for Sections or in the Section Constitution.
- 8. Failure of a Section to maintain the required activities, which shall include the holding of at least five meetings each year and also the maintenance of a minimum membership of twenty-five members, other than Students, shall place the Section on probation. All members of the Section shall be informed of the probation by the General Manager who shall also call their attention to the requirements for maintaining the Section. If the delinquency continues for a second year, a second notification to the Section membership shall be made by the General Manager and the Executive Committee shall be informed of the probationary status of the Section. If the delinquency continues throughout a third year, the Section shall, thereupon, automatically be dissolved and all assets reverted to IEEE. The General Manager shall so report to the Executive Committee and so inform the members previously constituting that Section. The Executive Committee may waive the provisions herein regarding dissolution of a Section in case such Section becomes affected by war or any other force majeure, for the period of the duration thereof and for at least six months thereafter. Sections holding one or more Section Technical Conferences, as specified in Bylaw 402.10.c, shall be considered to have met the requirements for the holding of four of the five Section meetings per calendar year required in this Bylaw.

- 9. Section Secretaries shall forward to the General Section Secretaries Shall section held by the Section Manager a report of each any, for the presentation or and its Subsections, if any, for the presentation or and its Subsections, it and, discussion of papers, and at the end of each calendar, etatement for that calendar year, a financial statement for that calendar year year, a financial Statement the Regional Directors
- 10. For the maintenance of a Section the IEEE shall credit to the Section for each calendar year.
  - a. Basic allowance there shall be an allowance of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per Section
  - b. Member allowance there shall be an allowance Member allowance of not less than one dollar and ten cents (\$1.10) per member except Students.
  - c. Meeting allowance there shall be an allowance of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per meeting for not less than ten meetings of the Section within the calendar year. There shall be an allowance of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per meeting for not more than ten meeting of the Subsection within the calendar year. There shall be an allowance of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for not more than one Section Technical Conference per year, when such a conference is held under the conditions specified in the IREE Section Manual.
  - d. Group allowance for each Group Chapter, the Issue shall credit not less than fifteen dollars (\$15.00 to a Section for each meeting of the Section promoted by a Chapter up to ten meetings per Chapter per year, provided such meeting is attended by ten or more Section members and a report of such meeting, including a statement of the number of members attending, signed by a Chapter officer. is forwarded to IEEE Headquarters through the Section Secretary-Treasurer. A meeting of the Section promoted by a Chapter may be counted among the above ten or may be counted among ten meetings of the Section as provided in these Bylaws, but not among both as such would result in duplicate payments for the same meeting.
  - e. Group Chapter membership allowance for each Group Chapter membership held by each Section member as of December 31 of each year, there shall be an allowance of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) per Chapter membership.
  - f. Affiliate of Group allowance there shall be an allowance of fifty cents (\$0.50) for each Affiliate of each and every Group having a mailing address within the territory of the Section as of December 31 of the calendar year for which payment is
- 11. Local voluntary financial contributions may be accepted by Sections.
- 12. Any Section that publishes a periodical shall inform the Executive Committee of the establishment thereof and shall provide IEEE Headquarters with copies thered as published.
- 13. Two or more Sections in a Region may join in mutual support of the following activities:

Joint Publications Joint Meetings, Conferences or Symposia Joint Chapter Meetings Student Activities Business Administration

and such related activities as may be approved from time to time by the Sections Committee. If in pursuit such joint activities it appears desirable to establish a formal aggregation of Sections, to be called a country to be and to be governed by Bylaws, this may be done under provisions of Bylaw 403.

- councils may be established within a Region as councils may be sections contained therein. A aggregation of the contained therein. A council derives its powers from those contained in these Bylaws for Sections.
- A Region may petition the Executive Committee A Region may be stablishment of a Council. Such regarding shall include petitions from those conpetition shall be bettern from those contiguous Sections within the Region supporting and opposing the formation of the Council. It shall opposing the recommendations of the Regional gommittee and the Regional Director. Favorable action by the Executive Committee is necessary for the establishment of a Council.
- Bach Council shall have a council Committee which shall consist of at least the Council Chairman, the junior past Council Chairman, the Council student Activities Committee Chairman, if such Committee exists, and one representative of each Section in the Council appointed by the Section Executive Committee.
- . Each member of the Council Committee shall be of Member, Senior Member or Fellow grade in the IEEE. The term of office of each member shall be one year. concurrent with the term of office of the Section
- 5. The Council Committee shall hold at least one meeting each year, within the Region. A quorum for a Council Committee meeting shall consist of a majority of the members of the Committee or their alternates and shall include representatives from at least half of the Sections of the Council. The Council Chairman, or, in the event of his unavailability, a Council Committee Vice Chairman, shall be responsible for calling the necessary number of Council Committee meetings.
- 6. The duties of the Council Committee shall include the annual election of all Council officers and the coordination of all Section activities within the Council as outlined in the Council Manual.
- 7. The Council Chairman shall be Chairman of the Council Committee. The duties of the Secretary-Treasurer shall include correspondence, the keeping of the minutes of the Committee meetings, mailing notices, handling of funds, the keeping of financial records, the submission of a report at the end of each year and such other duties as are assigned to him by the Chairman.
- 8. Pending installation of the first Council Chairman of the Council, the Regional Director shall appoint a Chairman pro tem of the Council Committee, and the Chairman pro tem may appoint a Secretary-Treasurer pro tem.
- 9. Each Council Committee shall conduct its activities within the Constitution, Bylaws and other rules externally imposed which by law affect the membership and activities of the IEEE. Councils shall have the right to obligate their funds for all purposes necessary to promote their objectives except that no Council or any officer or representative thereof shall have any authority to contract debts for, pledge the credit of, or in any way bind the IEEE for those activities specifically prohibited in the Manual for Councils and those prohibited to individual Sections, as provided in Bylaw 402.7.

# Subsections

1. In conformance with the Constitution for Sections, a Section may establish Subsections which shall be geographical subdivisions of the Section, subject to the same limitations and control as the Section itself, pursuant to the following conditions:

- a. In the case of Subsections, a petition shall be submitted to the parent Section Executive Committee signed by not fewer than twenty members other than Students, having mailing addresses within the territorial limits proposed in the petition. The territorial limits of the proposed Subsection shall be specifically delineated in the petition;
- b. Approval of the petition by the parent Section Executive Committee and the Regional Director;
- c. Notification to the General Manager of actions by a Section regarding Subsections with a copy of petition or petitions;
- d. Approval by the Executive Committee.
- 2. Failure of a Subsection to maintain the required activities which shall include the holding of at least five meetings each year and also the maintenance of a minimum membership of fifteen members, other than Students, shall place the Subsection on probation. All members of the Section shall be informed of the probation by the General Manager who shall also call their attention to the requirements for maintaining a Subsection. If the delinquency continues throughout a second year, a second notification to the Section membership shall be made by the General Manager, and the Executive Committee shall be informed of the probationary status of the Subsection. If the delinquency continues for a third year, the Subsection shall, thereupon, automatically be dissolved. The General Manager shall so report to the Executive Committee and so inform the members of the Section. The Executive Committee may waive the provisions herein regarding the dissolution of a Subsection in case such Subsection becomes affected by war or any other force majeure, for the period of the duration thereof and for at least six months thereafter.
- 3. Subsection affiliation shall be determined by the member's mailing address.

#### 405. Groups

- 1. There shall be established within the scope and objectives of the IEEE groups of members interested in specific technical fields or related subjects, designated as Groups.
- 2. A petition for the formation of a Group shall be signed by not fewer than one hundred members, other than Students, shall state the proposed field of interest and shall be forwarded to the Executive Committee after review thereof by the Technical Activities Board.
- 3. The Executive Committee, upon receipt of a petition to form a Group, and subsequent to consultation with the Technical Activities Board, may authorize its formation. After the Group is organized and a Constitution for it is approved by the Executive Committee, the Executive Committee may give final approval to its establishment.
- Each Group authorized by the Executive Committee shall within not more than six months thereafter adopt and conform to a Group Constitution which shall have been submitted to and approved by the Executive Committee. A Group Constitution may be amended by the Group subject to the approval of the Executive Committee. Such Group Constitution shall provide for a Group Chairman and a Secretary-Treasurer.
- 5. Each IEEE Group authorized by the Executive Committee may publish a periodical incorporating papers of lasting value to the profession in the field of interest of the Group and designated as the "IEEE Transactions on \_\_\_\_\_." Each Group having such a publication shall also establish a review procedure complying with a uniform IEEE policy.

- 6. All Groups shall consist exclusively of IEEE members and such Group Affiliates as may be recognized by the Executive Committee. No Group shall be recognized as joint with any other organization, society or group outside the IEEE. However, Groups may cooperate with other organizations in the holding of joint meetings and may invite members of such organizations and the public to their meetings.
- 7. The expenses for operating a Group shall be defrayed through the levying of fees or other charges approved by the Executive Committee. Group fees shall be applied to membership in the respective Groups as follows:

Fees received in the period October 1 to December 31, inclusive, shall apply to membership to December 31 of the following year.

Fees received in the period January 1 to March 31, inclusive, shall apply to membership to December 31 of the then current year.

If Group fee payments are received in the period April 1 to September 30, inclusive, the amount payable shall be one half of the annual fee, and the membership shall continue until December 31 of the then current year.

- 8. The Executive Committee shall establish each year a TAB Subsidy Fund, and shall set its total amount. The Subsidy Fund shall be administered by the Vice President Technical Activities, in consultation with the Technical Activities Board, the Publications Board, the Vice President Publication Activities, and such others as may have pertinent information and interests. There shall be provided for each new Group matching funds of one dollar (\$1.00) for each dollar of income derived by the Group from the membership fees during the first two years.
- All IEEE members may become members of Groups in conformance with the respective Group Constitution.
- 10. All Group meetings shall be open to all members of the IEEE on an equal basis with Group members. Any IEEE member or any Group Affiliate, upon payment of charges judged to be equitable by the Executive Committee, shall receive notices of meetings of any Group.
- 11. An IEEE Group by itself, or jointly with other organizations, may hold conferences, conventions, or offer lectures and may charge for registration, but any such charge must apply to the entire meeting and no separate registration charge shall be made for that portion of the meeting sponsored by the Group.
- 12. All publications of Groups, other than programs, notices, and the like, shall be subject to prior authorization of the Executive Committee and shall be made available to all IEEE members and Group Affiliates on equitable bases approved by the Executive Committee.
- 13. The Groups may prepare Standards recommendations, provided that advance approval for each such preparation is obtained from the Standards Committee.
- 14. Each Group shall forward to the General Manager a copy of each meeting notice of the Group, an annual report and a financial statement for each IEEE fiscal year prepared immediately following the end thereof.
- 15. Groups shall have the right to obligate their funds for all purposes necessary to promote their objectives except that no Group or any officer or representative thereof shall have any authority to contract debts for, pledge the credit of, or in any way bind the IEEE for those activities specifically prohibited in the Group Constitution or in the Technical Activities Manual.

- 16. Each Group shall conduct its activities within the constitution, Bylaws and other rules externally activities of the IEEE.
- 17. The Executive Committee, subsequent to consultation with the Technical Activities Board, may dissolve any Group for any reason deemed sufficient by the Executive Committee and any remaining funds in the custody of that Group shall revert to the IEEE.
- 18. Group Affiliates are non-IEEE members who have been admitted by a Group to some of the rights and privileges of Group activities. In general, a Group Affiliate must be a person whose technological activities do not justify full membership in the IEEE, but who may be helped by participation in Group activities or who may contribute benefits to Group members by his participation in their activities in rights and privileges shall be established by the Executive Committee.
- 19. The Groups are:

Additions or changes in the above list resulting from actions of the Executive Committee, as provided in Bylaw 405.3, shall be entered therein by the General Manager following action by the Executive Committee.

20. The formation and conduct of Groups shall be administered by the Technical Activities Board as provided in these Bylaws and the Technical Activities Manual.

#### 406. Group Chapters

- A Group Chapter may be established in a Section to function in the manner of a committee of a Section.
- A petition to establish a Chapter must contain the following:
  - a. Name of the Section.
  - b. Name of the Group.
- c. Name of the organizer (who becomes interim Chairman pending election of a regular Chairman at a later organization meeting).
  - d. Signatures of at least twelve IEEE members, other than Students, who must indicate they are either members of the Group involved, or are prepared to become members if the petition is granted.
- 3. The petition for a Chapter shall be submitted to the Section Executive Committee for written approval and forwarded with this written approval to the General Manager. The General Manager shall submit this petition to the Executive Committee for approval. Upon receiving approval, the existence of the new Chapter will be recorded at IEEE Headquarters and the Section Executive Committee will be informed thereof.

Failure of a Chapter to maintain the required pailure of shall place the Chapter on probation. activities and activities and all members of the Chapter shall be informed of a condition of the Gnarous the General Manager who shall also probation attention to the requirements for maincall their chapter. If the delinquency continues taining the assecond year, a second notification throughout shall be issued by the General Manager. If the shall be industrial manager. If the delinquency continues through a third year, the chapter shall, thereupon, automatically be dissolved and all assets reverted to IEEE. The General Manager shall so report to the Executive Committee and inform the Section Executive Committee and the members previously constituting that Chapter, of the dissolution. The Executive committee may waive the provisions herein regarding dissolution of a Chapter in case such Chapter becomes affected by war or any other force majeure, for the period of duration thereof and for at least six months thereafter.

# student Branches

- 1. There shall be established throughout the territory in which IEEE conducts operations, groups of Student members residing in specified geographical localities, designated as Student Branches or Student Associate Branches.
- 2. There shall be established Counselors who shall be IEEE members and teachers of electrical engineering, electronics, radio, allied branches of engineering or the related arts and sciences, at universities, colleges or technical institutes eligible for IEEE Student members, and who shall be appointed by the Regional Director in consultation with the Regional Student Activities Committee Chairman. Each such Counselor is charged with promoting the welfare of the IEEE at his institution, particularly in matters relating to Student activities.
- j. Upon receipt of a petition signed by the IEEE Counselor, or in the event one has not been appointed, by a representative of the faculty (who must be an IEEE member) of the educational institution involved, and by ten or more IEEE members who are students in a "school of recognized standing," the establishment of an IEEE Student Branch may be authorized at that institution, by the Executive Committee, upon the recommendation of the Regional Director.
- 4. Upon receipt of a petition signed by the IEEE Counselor, or in the event one has not been appointed, by a representative of the faculty (who must be an IEEE member) of the educational institution involved, and by ten or more IEEE members who are students in a school in which Student Associate membership is permitted, the establishment of a Student Associate Branch may be authorized in that institution, by the Executive Committee, upon the recommendation of the Regional Director.
- 5. Each IEEE Student Branch and each IEEE Student
  Associate Branch shall adopt and conform to a
  Student Branch Constitution which shall have been
  submitted to and approved by the Executive Committee.
- 6. The IEEE, by action of the Executive Committee, may Join with another engineering or technical society to co-sponsor a Joint Student Branch in a "school of recognized standing" or a Joint Student Associate Branch in an educational institution, other than a "school of recognized standing," provided it is approved by the Executive Committee, upon the recommendation of the Regional Director. The petition for the establishment of the Branch must be signed by the IEEE Counselor, or by a representative of the faculty (who must be an IEEE member) of the educational institution involved, in the event a counselor has not been appointed, and by ten or more Student members of the IEEE.

- 7. Each Joint Student Branch and each Joint Student
  Associate Branch shall adopt and conform to a Joint
  Student Branch Constitution which shall have been
  submitted to and approved by both the Executive
  Committee and the other co-sponsoring society.
- 8. IEEE Student Branches, IEEE Student Associate Branches, Joint Student Branches and Joint Student Associate Branches shall have the right to obligate their funds for all purposes necessary to promote their objectives, except that no IEEE Student Branch, IEEE Student Associate Branch, Joint Student Branch or Joint Student Associate Branch, or any officer or representative thereof, shall have any authority to contract debts for, pledge the credit of, or in any way bind the IEEE for those activities specifically prohibited in the Student Branch Constitution or in the Manual for Student Branches.
- 9. Each IEEE Student Branch, IEEE Student Associate Branch, Joint Student Branch and Joint Student Associate Branch shall forward to the General Manager a brief report of each meeting held by the Branch for the presentation or discussion of papers, and during January of each year, a financial statement for the preceding calendar year.
- 10. An IEEE Student Branch, IEEE Student Associate Branch, Joint Student Branch or Joint Student Associate Branch may defray expenses by assessment of its members as provided in its constitution and, in addition, may accept local noncompulsory financial contributions.

  Nonmember students of the institution where a Student Branch is established may attend the Student Branch meetings under such conditions as may be prescribed by the Student Branch.
- 11. Failure of an IEEE Student Branch or IEEE Student Associate Branch to maintain a minimum of ten IEEE Student members and to hold at least three meetings each year shall place the Branch on probation. The Regional Director, all officers of the Branch and the IEEE Counselor, or a representative of the faculty of the educational institution or other institute involved, in the event a counselor has not been appointed, shall be informed of the probation by the General Manager who shall also call to their attention the requirements for maintaining the Branch. If the delinquency continues for a second year, the IEEE sponsorship shall be withdrawn automatically. The General Manager shall so report to the Executive Committee and Regional Director, and so inform the former officers of the dissolved Branch and the TEEE Counselor.
- 12. Failure of a Joint Student Branch or Joint Student Associate Branch to maintain a minimum of ten IEEE members and to hold at least three meetings each year shall be reported by the General Manager to the Executive Committee and the Regional Director, and similar action as for delinquencies of IEEE Student Branches shall be taken following formal notification to the co-sponsoring society.
- 13. For maintenance of an IEEE Student Branch or Joint Student Branch, Student Associate Branch or Joint Student Associate Branch, upon certification by the IEEE Counselor or by a representative of the faculty of the educational institution where the Branch is located, in the event a counselor has not been appointed, the IEEE shall credit to each such Branch upon request, for any twelve-month period, the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for Branches with less than fifty members and fifty dollars (\$50.00) for Branches with fifty or more members; and shall also pay to each such Branch the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) for each IEEE Student member of the Branch as of December 31 of each year.

- 14. The Executive Committee may, after consultation with the Regional Director, dissolve an IEEE Student Branch or IEEE Student Associate Branch or withdraw its sponsorship and support of a Joint Student Branch or Joint Student Associate Branch for any reason deemed sufficient by the Executive Committee and upon notification to the Regional Director. Any remaining funds in the custody of that Branch, or Joint Branch, attributable to IEEE sponsorship, shall revert to the IEEE.
- 15. Each Branch shall conduct its activities within the Constitution, Bylaws, and other rules externally imposed which by law affect the membership and activities of the IEEE.
- 16. Partial reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses may be authorized by the Regional Director for the Counselor of each Student Branch, for the Student Branch Chairman and the Student paper first prize winner, if any, from any Branch to attend one meeting within his Region each year.

#### 500. PUBLICATIONS

#### 501. Periodicals

- The IEEE shall publish a monthly publication entitled "IEEE SPECTRUM" which shall be distributed to all Honorary Members, Fellows, Senior Members, Members, Associate Members and graduate Students. The Executive Committee may authorize distribution to other Students when appropriate.
- 2. The IEEE shall publish a monthly publication entitled "PROCEEDINGS OF THE IEEE." This publication shall be available to all IEEE members at a subscription fee set by the Executive Committee.
- 3. The IEEE shall publish periodicals produced by the various Groups named "Transactions on \_\_\_\_\_\_," where specialized technical papers shall be published.
- 4. The IEEE may publish periodicals, other than the Transactions defined in Bylaw 501.3, sponsored by one or more of the Groups, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee, subsequent to consultation with the Publications Board.
- 5. The IEEE may publish a periodical entitled "IEEE STUDENT JOURNAL." It shall contain technical articles and other material to assist Students with their career decisions. Distribution shall be at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
- 6. The IEEE may publish an annual Directory containing lists of its members, lists of manufacturers, supplies and products, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.
- 7. Member subscriptions to all periodicals shall terminate on December 31 of each year. Subscription fees received in the period October 1 to December 31, inclusive, shall extend the subscription to the period ending December 31 of the following year. Fees received in the period from January 1 to March 31, inclusive, shall apply to the period ending December 31 of the then current year. If payment for a subscription is received in the period April 1 to September 30, inclusive, the fee charged shall be one half the annual subscription fee, and shall apply to the period ending December 31 of the then current year.

#### 502. Other Publications

1. The IEEE may issue other special publications such as convention and conference records, cumulative indices, etc., when warranted.

#### 503. Standards

1. The IEEE may publish from time to time IEEE Standards concerning technologies encompassed within the scope of the purposes of the IEEE

#### 600. CONVENTIONS AND MEETINGS

#### 601. Annual International Convention

1. There shall be held annually in New York City in the month of March, or as near thereto as possible, a convention named the "IEEE International Convention and Exhibition." The IEEE shall be the sole sponsor.

#### 602. Regional Meetings

 Regionally organized and sponsored meetings may be held with the approval of the Executive Committee for the presentation of technical papers.

#### 603. Special Technical Conferences

1. Special Technical Conferences may be held with the approval of the Executive Committee. These conferences shall be for the presentation of technical papers on a particular phase of the IEEE's technical activities.
