Dear Mr. Hering:

Referring to your inquiry of November 16th, the expiring dates of the various groups of members of the Edison Medal Committee as printed on page 268 of the November Proceedings are correct with the exception of the first and fifth groups. The first, comprising yourself, Professor Ryan and Mr. H. G. Stott, should be transposed to the position of the fifth group, and under the heading "Term expires July 31, 1920", this group having been appointed for five years, and the fifth group, comprising Mr. Wershon, Mr. Sprague and Dr. Wheeler, should be transposed to the position now occupied by the first group, and should be under the heading "Term expires July 31, 1916." The two headings are in the correct positions, but the names should be transposed, and this has already been taken care of for the December Proceedings, as we discovered the transposition prior to calling the last meeting of the committee.

The responsibility for this rests with our printer. In the September issue the several groups were correctly arranged, under the correct headings, with the latest expiring group or dates, at the top. It was suggested that a more logical arrangement would be to place the earliest expiring dates at the top, reversing the order in which they were printed, and in the effort to do this our printer got the groups mixed.

We thank you for calling our attention to the error, even though in this case we had noted it, as errors of this kind are so liable to pass unnoticed.
