E. SUMMARY

The conference chairman or his delegate is asked to give a brief summary of his general impression of the successes and shortcomings of the conference. He should: (1) emphasize how coverage can be improved to better further IEEE's objectives; (2) comment on whether or not the conference is gaining or losing support of members and exhibitors in relation to prior years; and give an estimate of future trends of the conference plus suggestions for improvement. In spite of many problems, the Conference Chairman considers the Convention a success. Financially, it is anticipated that when reimbursement is received from IEEE Headquarters for publications and IEEE Headquarters is paid for mailing lists, the Convention will have realized a surplus of \$400-\$500 or about 5 per cent of total receipts. This has been managed with an operating capital of only \$700 or a return of more than 50 percent on the capital outlay. If the Conference Committee had been better able to estimate receipts and expenditures it may have been able to do without the solicitation of support from sponsors when it appeared that income was not going to be as great as expected. It is difficult to see how coverage could have been improved to better further IEEE's objectives. The Technical Program appeared to be excellent. Perhaps some assessment of the Region 3 membership to determine what they need or want would be in order. One problem in a regional convention is that because of the diversified technical interests in the Region it is difficult to plan a program of interest to all IEEE members in the Region. Perhaps emphasis should be given to supporting more but smaller conferences or symposia throughout the Region on specialized technical disciplines in cooperation with the Professional Groups. It would seem that the conference lost some support of members and exhibitors this year because of the economic slump nationally but especially locally in connection with Government programs. Neither could Huntsville be expected to compete with the resort environment of Cocoa Beach, or New Orleans. The timing with respect to the academic year may also have had an adverse effect.

Finally, if Regional Conventions are to be continued I would suggest that a Convention Sub-committee be established within the Regional Executive Committee, to be alternated over periods of two or three years, so that Subcommittee members may pass on to their successors their experience and new members of the Subcommittee may serve some sort of apprenticeship before taking charge of a Convention. The problems of running a Convention are many and varied and it is hardly practical to discuss them all in a summary such as this. Many of our problems stem from not paying closer attention to the IEEE material on "Organizing




