Remembering Steve Mallard

Steve Mallard [1924-2014]

Steve Mallard was an IEEE Fellow, and long-time member of the North Jersey Section. He was past section chair (1966-67); and my life-long role model and mentor at PSE&G.

I write this remembrance with gratitude and great respect for the man



As I sit here in my home writing lair, staring at my IEEE membership card, I ponder how quickly the 43+ years of membership have passed. I remember the moment Steve Mallard urged me to get involved with IEEE; and now with Steve's passing, that moment of guidance becomes ever more poignant.

I had the pleasure of knowing him since 1970; and working directly for him for 20 years. He was a seminal influence on my engineering career. The greatest lesson I learned from Steve was the difference between leadership and management, something Steve practiced daily "Walking the talk", as they say. His consistent striving for excellence impressed us all at PSE&G.

A regular saying he perpetuated was "If you have done something worthy of review, be proud to sign your work; and be prepared to stand- up and ask for the money to implement it at the annual budget review meetings." Steve believed in getting his young engineers in front of the senior managers at PSE&G so they could develop presentation experience. That, and clear, concise written expression were highly prized skills in his department. As I would stand there, making my budget pitch to grizzled chief executives, "trembling in my young boots", I knew Steve's big guns were ready to provide coverfire if needed. He was always there as your backstop; content and comfortable with letting his young engineers get credit for their work- building a corporate reputation. He stood out among his peers in this approach to developing talent.

IEEE Winter Power Engineering Society meetings back then were held in January in NYC. We young engineers were required to attend the various sessions and write up what we learned, and to exchange this information with our colleagues in Steve's System Planning Department. He always encouraged each of us to write a paper for these annual sessions, and to participate in relevant IEEE committees throughout the year. Steve was the IEEE flag-pole for the department.

He took a deep interest in my first large project, development of a graphical computer system for portraying and analyzing sub-transmission circuit load flow runs directly on a CRT. I still remember his excitement at first seeing this interactive system up and running. Throughout the design and development of the system, Steve was there with sage advice and counsel as this young engineer cut his project management teeth. Back in 1974/75, \$300,000 was a big

chunk of change for a new piece of power system analytical hardware and software; and Steve trusted me with it.

After enjoying this "design and build something from scratch" project, I asked Steve to transfer me to the R&D department, also under his purview. Project management had gotten in my blood; and Steve realized I had a passion to bring new ideas and concepts to practical form. He was always interested and protective of the company's R&D efforts-knowing the future value of developing new technology. Here again, he stood out among his peers, championing and establishing one of the first R&D departments in the electric utility industry

If I close my eyes, I can see Steve and I sitting in the old 744 Club in Newark, talking and languishing over lunch—a kind of quarterly project review meeting...no formalities..., just a delightful discussion about where each project was, lessons learned, mistakes corrected, and some new ideas for the future. He seemed to have as much fun with new technology as me; and sometimes I think he would have liked to trade all those executive meetings for a couple weeks--- get his hands dirty, and fly by the seat of his pants. I always came away so refreshed and re-committed from those lunches. He so believed in my work and my capabilities.

A "Steve moment" comes to mind. I was heading out to San Francisco for a meeting, and had been working quite hard on some robotic applications. Steve called me after receiving and reviewing my trip request and told me to add several days onto my trip, to take some time to rest and smell the flowers out there. He suggested a visit to the redwood forest and some other attractions; and then told me not to be back at work before a certain date. He concluded our conversation with a hearty congratulation on my accomplishments, and told me how proud he was of my work. He also mentioned something that has echoed so profoundly in my psyche. He told me to always remember that in the grand scheme of things, it was family and God first, the job second. That says more about the man's character and perspective than I could ever pen.

Another memorable moment came after he had retired from PSE&G. He learned I had received an IEEE award, and called me at home to lavish praise. For me, Steve was the kind of ideal manager/leader talked about in today's modern business books. He was the last person in the world I ever wanted to disappoint.

We stayed in touch throughout his retirement. When he saw I was developing a very strong interest in writing and publishing educational books, he was incredibly supportive. I would send him copies of my articles and he would offer comments and guidance for future writings. I was blessed to have so many years of his caring mentorship.

Upon learning of Steve's passing, I contacted many old PSE&G friends and IEEE colleagues. In responding back to me, the same descriptors were evident: "incredible manager"; "caring and gentle"; "true gentleman".

We all have to leave this earthly place; and if there is a good time to go...I would have to say I am glad Steve died in the spring. It is fitting that during this season of re-birth and renewal that a renaissance man like Steve should be called home. Spring so epitomizes his life.....ever green in outlook.



I will always hear his voice in my head, and it will continue to guide me. I am grateful for everything he taught me; and I promise to do my best to pass it along to those I am privileged to mentor. His story is a true example of IEEE member-to-member mentorship.

Obituary for Morris (Mike) Perugini

Morris (Mike) Perugini, originally from Jessup, Pennsylvania passed away on May 24th after a long illness. A resident of Mt. Arlington since 1965, Mike was a graduate of Girard College High School in Philadelphia and served in the U.S. Navy as a Petty Officer First Class in Interior Communications on the U.S.S. Fulton out of New London, Connecticut. He went on to earn his B.S. in Electrical Engineering from Newark College of Engineering (now NJIT), an M.A. in Industrial Management from City University of New York, and was a Life Member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).

Mike was also certified by the state of New Jersey as a tax assessor, tax collector and chief financial officer and in those capacities he served various communities in Morris, Sussex, Warren and Bergen counties. In addition, he served on the Planning Board and Town Council in the borough of Mt. Arlington and was an usher for over 40 years at Our Lady of the Lake church.

Although he was born at the start of the Great Depression and lost his own father at the age of 7, Mike worked hard all his life - to get a good education, to serve his country and his community, and to care for his family. He was a truly selfless person who put the needs of others before his own, and who was a devoted son, brother, husband, father and grandfather. He enjoyed camping, traveling, spending time with his family, crossword puzzles and Sudoku, as well as an occasional trip to the slot machines. He will be remembered by many for his sense of humor, his honesty and integrity. The family hopes he

will once again enjoy Tuesday night poker games with his friends Hal and Andy.

His parents, Romeo and Christina (Nedorostek) Perugini, preceded him in death, as did his brothers Louis and Joseph, and his sisters Elizabeth (all from Buena, New Jersey) and Norma Pagano, of Richland. He is survived by his loving wife of 57 years, Audrey (nee Beattie), son James of Mount Arlington, daughter Valerie and her husband Dennis Sullivan of Mount Olive, daughter Carol and Justin Tindall of Bruneau, Idaho, and daughter Nancy and her husband David Riggs of New Fairfield, Connecticut. In addition, he leaves four grandchildren: Sarah and Jenna Sullivan, and Lindsay and Sam Riggs, as well as several nieces and nephews.

IEEE CNNNJ present - Design of Devices to Augment Human Movement

Speaker: John Rogers of US Military Academy in West Point **Abstract: Simulation-based Design of Devices to Augment Human Movement** - Musculoskeletal dynamic simulation can be used to aid the design of devices that augment human movement. Devices in this category are like exoskeletons for single joints—they augment the load-carrying ability of the human by taking a share of the torque at the body joint.

The design of devices requires knowledge of the expected speed, torque, and power profiles at the joint over time for a particular motion (like running). In-vivo measurement of these quantities is inherently difficult, but they can be predicted by simulation. This study demonstrates how to use the joint torques and power from simulation to help select motors and springs for an augmentation device. The brief will show how to estimate motor speed, torque, current, and power for a hypothetical hip actuator for augmented running.

Biography: John R. Rogers, Ph.D., P.E., is an Associate Professor in the Department of Civil and Mechanical Engineering at West Point, the United States Military Academy. He teaches mechatronic design, computer graphics, programming, dynamics, and engineering materials. His research interests are the design of unmanned systems, modeling of dynamic systems, and the biomechanics of machine-assisted human movement.

Dr. Rogers earned the Ph.D. degree in mechanical engineering at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in 2003. Prior to joining West Point, he built and tested underwater systems, analyzed structures, and designed industrial electro-hydraulic systems. He can be contacted at John.Rogers@usma.edu.

Speaker: Muhammad Mustafa Hussain of Computer Electrical Mathematical Science and Engineering Division King Abdullah University of Science and Technology **Abstract:** Complementary growth of information technology and CMOS electronics has advanced today's digital world. Looking forward we will see unusual applications of them focusing on smart living and sustainable future. Transformation of materials, device architecture to waste materials can serve both purposes. Using conventional CMOS processes, we have introduced the concept of transformational electronics. While retaining high performance, energy efficiency, multi-functionality due to ultra-large-scaleintegration (ULSI) density and low-cost, we bring life to formerly dead piece of electronics by integrating web into it. Our objective is to discover new application areas for electronics and web to integrate physical electronics with our daily life through cloud computation, big data, cyber-physical system, ultra-mobile computation and virtual reality. A few examples of such transformational electronics will be shown: 1) Transformation of device architecture: silicon nanotube field effect transistor and beyond. [Nano Lett. 2011, Sci. Rep. 2012, IEEE TED 2013] 2) Transformation of flexible-stretchable-transparent nanoelectronic systems. [Adv. Mat. 2014, ACS Nano 2014, Sci. Rep. 2013, Small 2013, IEEE TED 2013, APL 2013] 3) Transformation of waste materials: micro-sized microbial fuel cells and thermoelectric windows, INPG Asia Mat. 2014, ACS Nano 2013, Sci. Rep. 2012, Nano Lett. 2012]

Biography: John R. Rogers, Ph.D., P.E., is an Associate Professor in Dr. Muhammad Mustafa Hussain (PhD, University of Texas at Austin, Dec 2005) is an Associate Professor of Electrical Engineering in KAUST. Before joining KAUST in Aug 2009, he was Program Manager of Novel Emerging Technology Program at SEMATECH, Austin, Texas. His program was funded by DARPA NEMS, CERA and STEEP programs. A regular panelist of US NSF grants reviewing committees, Dr. Hussain is the Editor-in-Chief of Applied Nanoscience (Springer) and an IEEE Senior Member since February 2010. He has 168 research papers (including 11 invited and 10 cover articles). Prof. Hussain has given 45 invited talks and has offered 3 tutorials in international conferences. He has 15 issued and pending US patent applications. His 4 PhD graduates have landed researcher positions in UC Berkeley, UC Davis and in DOW Chemicals. His students have won numerous research awards including DOW Chemical SISCA Award 2012, World Intellectual Property Indicator 2013. Dr. Hussain is an IEEE Electron Devices Society Distinguished Lecturer and a Fellow of Institute of Nanotechnology, UK.
