VISUAL BASIC 5.0

Tuesday Evenings, September 22 – December 15, 1998 GEC Marconi Plant 11, 164 Totowa Road, Totowa, NJ

The IEEE is offering an evening course entitled "Visual BASIC 5.0." This comprehensive course is intended for programmers migrating from procedural languages to "Visual BASIC." Prerequisites for the course are a familiarity with Windows 95, knowledge of a procedural language, such as BASIC or C, and programming concepts, access to Microsoft Visual BASIC as well as Microsoft Windows 95. Upon completion, students will understand event driven programming; standard control objects and their associated properties, methods and events; have the ability to design application solutions. The course will run for 12 weeks. Each session will run for 2 ½ hours with a short break approximately in the middle. A textbook with CD ROM and all text materials required will be provided.

TOPICS

- Introduction to Visual BASIC; Naming conventions; Creating a Graphical User Interface (GUI); Properties, Events and Methods for forms, Text Boxes, Command buttons and labels; Event procedures; Variable declarations; Environment options; Saving programs.
- Scope: Code modules: variables end constants; Built-in functions; Expressions and statements; Finite and dynamic arrays; Static variables: Procedures and functions; passing data by reference or value; Program flow constructs.
- Debug tools; Properties, events and methods for lines, shapes, check boxes, option buttons, frames, picture boxes and 3. images; Toolbar; Status bar; Z Order; Control arrays.
- Properties; events and methods for list boxes and combo boxes.
- Properties, events and methods for horizontal/vertical scroll bars and timers.
- Multiple form projects; Error trapping and handling.
- Data manager and the data control; Data-aware controls; Grid control.
- Multiple Document Interface (MDI) Forms; Menu design.
- Keyboard events; Dynamic Link Libraries (DLL). 9.
- 10. Clipboard; Shell function; Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE).
- 11. Object Linking and Embedding (OLE), OLE automation.
