Your circular letter of July 30th concerning diplomas, is at hand.

As a rule I do not lay any value on such diplomas and make no use of those that I have. I do not therefore care to go to any expense to get another. Your printed circular moreover does not state what the cost is; but if I understand from the word "entitled" that there is no expense attached to it, then I might as well have one.

I therefore express herewith in writing my willingness to surrender this diploma in case I should for any reason cease to be a member of the Institute. Also that my name is to appear as it is on this letterhead. You say nothing about titles, hence I presume these are omitted. I remind you of the fact that I am a life member, which statement on the diploma I should attach some value to; hence if it is not against your rules, I would suggest that this be added.

From the wording of your rule, this diploma would have to be surrendered upon my death, but I presume you do not mean this, as of course no improper use could be made of it by me or anyone else after my death.
