"High Resolution Microwave Imaging"

There are several intrinsic problems in high resolution microwave imaging, all stemming from long wavelengths, as compared to optics, used in microwave systems. Because of the long wavelengths, the scattering properties of targets are different, the apertures must be huge and are therefore mechanically unstable, the dynamic range of target echoes is so large as to hide the weak scattering from the edges and boundaries that define target shape, the information content in the image is very low while the data rate requirement of the image processor can exceed the RF, and there is often so strong an angular dependence as to cause different images of a target to look like different targets.

These and other problems are discussed and solutions offered. The radio camera is described. X-bank experimental high resolution imagery illustrates the problems and the solutions.


